8.	Planning	<p><b>Loch Chon</b> Ongoing planning application by the National Park to install a campsite at Loch Chon. The public meeting earlier in the week had been well attended by local residents and National Park representatives, but further information was still required, also communication with the National Park and others. The general opinion by local residents was not in favour of the site and there was a list of specific objections. However the Park had provided some useful information and reassurances. A Loch Ard wild camping site which did not form part of the application was also planned. 9.	Reports:	<p><u>Finances:</u> No movement.</p> <p><u>Stirling Councillors:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Stirling Council was now in recess for the summer. The accounts were available with an underspend for the year, but with outstanding work to be completed on culverts and ditches.</li> <li>▪ Construction on the HMS Forth was nearing completion and as the ships name was affiliated to the town of Stirling, key members of the Stirling community would be invited to the launching.</li> <li>▪ As part of the local development plan the responsibility for parking issues would be changing in October, to the Council.</li> </ul> <p><u>Police:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ There had been a disturbance with damage outside of the Forth Inn and a minor road collision in Trossachs Road damaging a parked vehicle</li> </ul>

Positive lines of enquiry were being followed.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Reported thefts in surrounding areas whereby trailers and machinery have been stolen, with some of the property being recovered by Police. Local community residents should remain vigilant and to report any suspicious activity to Police Scotland on 101 or 999 in an emergency.</li> <li>▪ A Police Surgery would be held within the Tourist Information Office, Main Street, Aberfoyle on 27<sup>th</sup> July.</li> <li>▪ Ironworks Patrols had encountered few reported problems. During the patrols police engaged with the campers and offered advice with regards to their behaviour.</li> <li>▪ The air weapon amnesty has now finished, although anyone who still has an air weapon and wishes to relinquish it prior to the Licensing regulations coming into force are still able to do so at their local Police Office. Details of Air Weapon Licensing can be found on the Police Scotland Website.</li> </ul> <p><u>Broadband:</u> BT is no longer considering upgrading the service to Kinlochard to superfast broadband and the Kinlochard Broadband Group is working with Community Broadband Scotland. The situation in Aberfoyle is delayed and the position for Inversnaid remains unclear.
