



R-29 of the type Fokker CV M/33, which was manufactured under license in Denmark. The Norwegian Air Force included 24 machines of this type - 12 in the version IIR (R-21 to R-32) and 12 in the version IIIR (R-41 - R-52).

During the attack on Værløse Airfield on 9 April 1940, R-49 was shot down, while R-22, R-30 and R-32 were destroyed on the ground. The other machines were subsequently stored, and after 29 August 1943 at least some of them were used by the Germans.

The aircraft type was armed with two fixed and one movable 8mm machine gun; it could carry a bomb load of 300 kilos.

Note: A closer study of the cut sheet together with photographs of aircraft of the Fokker CV M/33 shows some inconsistencies.

It is thus not a precise reproduction of a machine in Danish service, but a drawing of a biplane which looks like an aircraft in Danish service. The plane in the drawing is then "christened" R.-29.
