The collection was then completely or partially disposed of, as the Hegelunds' interests changed, e.g. for model railways.

Helge Scheunchen also says that Hugo Bülow-Madsen was quite a handy person, which his figures clearly testify to.

#### Chakoten anno 1946

The very first issue of Chakoten - a duplicate folio sheet, folded once - contains a membership list that numbered a total of 13 people, and the magazine announcing that the next issue would include a list of "corresponding members" as well as "members abroad".
