Scrapbook: Denmark's army and navy

Introduction

As a supplement to my description of the cut-out sheets from the booklet "Danmarks Hær og Flaade" there are now pictures of the vast majority of things relating to the navy.

Niels Blangsted-Jensen has been kind enough to make his "remains" of the cut-out sheets available for both scanning and description. Compared to the cut-out figures which were the subject of the scan, the reproductions here have been processed so that the background now appears uniformly rectangular. The original sheets contained a naval insignia as well as 5 more war veterans - similar uniforms to the one shown here, but different in terms of hair colour, among other things.

The Navy 1941

The ships on the sheets are identified as:

- The torpedo boat GLENTEN.
- The artillery ship PEDER SKRAM.
- Artillery ship NIELS IUEL.

The figures on the sheets represent:

- Crown Prince Frederik.
- War captain.
- Sea lieutenant of the 1st degree.
- Machinist of the 3rd degree.
- Orloggast.

The shield represents:

- 40 mm anti-aircraft gun. 20
- mm machine gun.
