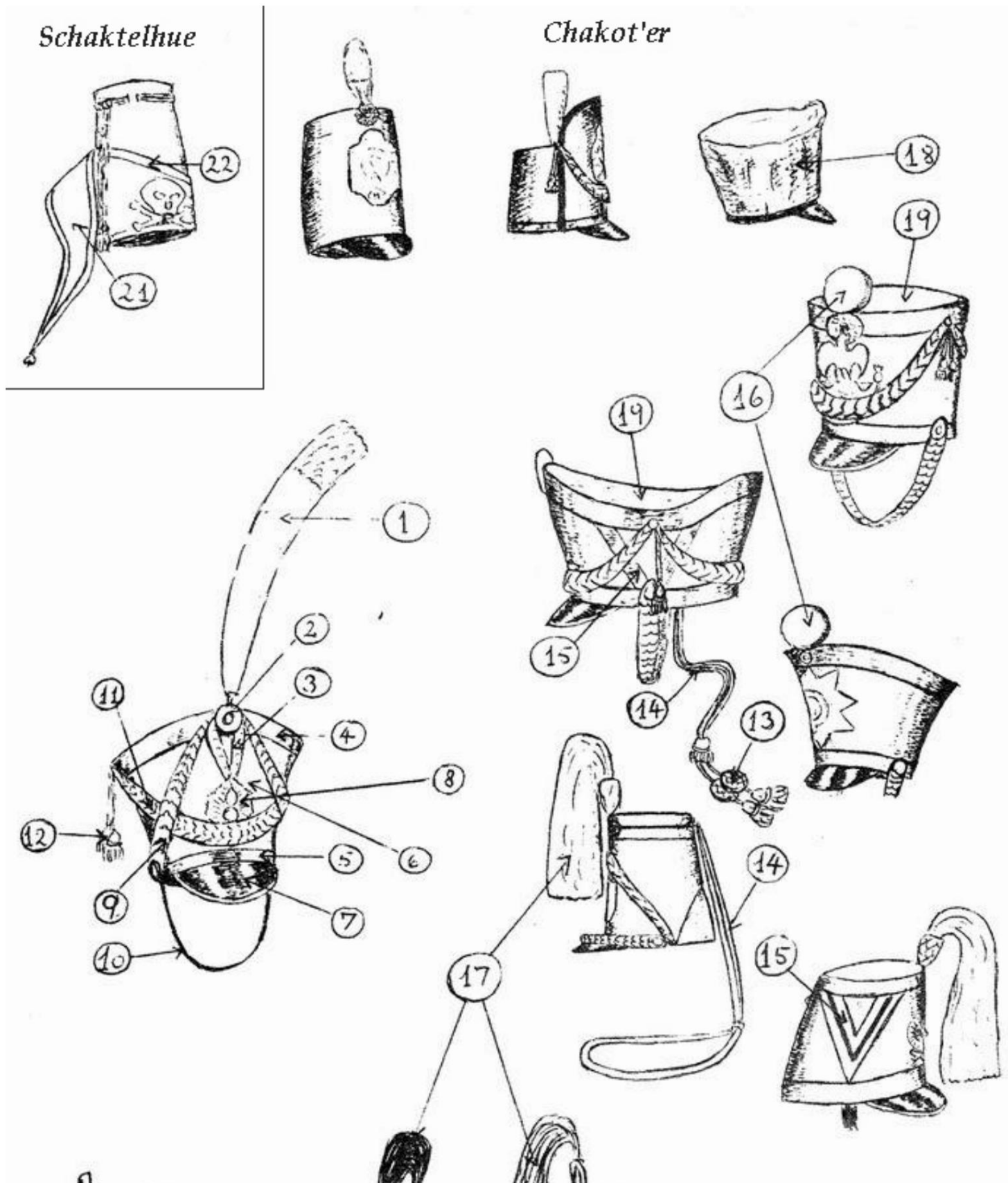
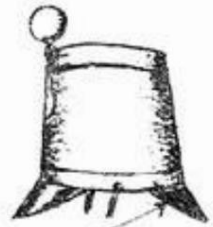


# A review of the chakot and its individual parts
