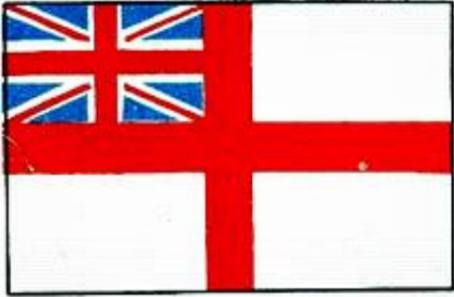


Scrapbook - Royal Navy

Introduction

ROYAL-NAVY



The drawings of English warships introduced here come from a booklet entitled *Royal Navy*. The booklet contains four sheets. Each sheet measures approx. 25 cm in height and approx. 34 cm in width.

The artist and the publisher do not appear in the small booklet in which the four perforated sheets are placed.



The only identification is a mark with a burning torch, but which publisher or printing company had such a logo is currently unknown.

The year of publication is unknown, but I assume the sheets are from around 1946.

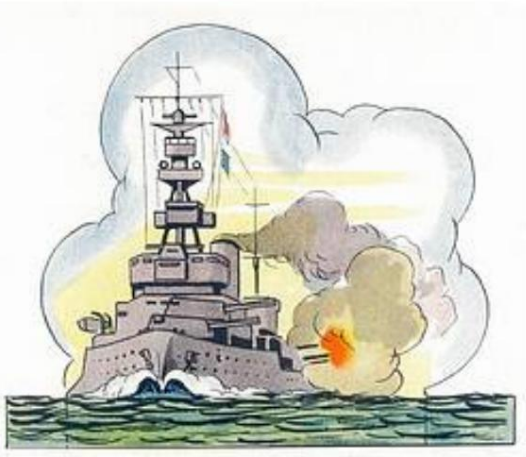
The drawings

The booklet contains a total of 24 drawings.

The motifs are battleships, cruisers, destroyers, aircraft carriers, motor torpedo boats (or motor gunboats), submarines and two torpedo planes.
