## 1999-2000: CWDG's millennium soul-searching ...

- An ambitious programme for One World Week (October 1999) had mixed results, raising major questions about CWDG's future balance of effort
  - An "Options Paper" was produced for discussion in Jan 2000 ....

**Option 1:** Group itself to wind-up, confident in the ability of its constituent members to sustain the "development message"

**Option 2:** Group to continue, primarily for networking and information exchange – "action of the ground" undertaken by member groups

**Option 3:** In addition to networking & information exchange, Group would give each year give strong practical support to a particular campaign being run by one of its members

**Option 4:** Group to become more pro-active, promoting its own branded programmes – and exploring all means of enabling it to take on part-time paid assistance for running these programmes

### 1999-2000: CWDG's millennium soul-searching ...

The conclusion: pursue Option 2 ½ ....

- Prime purpose is to provide useful means of networking between established and emerging groups and interested individuals
- Provide active encouragement and assistance for others organising events that take the development message to a wider audience
- Continue with bi-monthly networking meetings mainly domestic, though visiting speakers always welcome. ("Crowd-pulling" speakers will be treated to well-publicised public meetings)
- Details of these arrangements to be worked out by a planning group paving the way for an ongoing steering group/ committee

### 2016 – 17: Further soul-searching – how to sustain our membership?
