Reports from around the table:

PP: Church Action on Poverty joining with Trussel Trust and Foodbank for Christmas.

TW: thanks on behalf of Chester CND to CWDF for the donation towards advert. Advert in paper on 9<sup>th</sup> Dec

MR: Raised the issue of use of plastic in food packaging. Greenpeace campaigning on reducing use of plastic and there are petitions on line for people to sign

TW: Ellesmere Port quizzes in aid of CAFOD continuing. There were over 70 people at last quiz which raised over £300

BR: Thanked us for advertising Christian Aid's Bible in a Day in the Cathedral which raised over £4000 to date.

BR: Re anniversary of Balfour Declaration - 12 people from Chester went to London for rally on 5<sup>th</sup> Nov.

BR: Commented on the very interesting talk/film on the subject of the Balfour Declaration held 20<sup>th</sup> Oct in the University.

BR urged members to lobby MPs on Palestine/Israel issue as there is to be a debate in Parliament soon

BR: Response to Christian Aid's "The Big Shift" campaign. Signatures had been collected on post-it notes urging the major banks to invest more in renewable energy and less in fossil fuels. The post-it notes were the placed on the large poster of "Prudence Pig" accompanied by a letter to the banks' CEOs and general staff and then presented to banks in town on 26<sup>th</sup> Oct. by Trevor and Caroline Dennis, Brian and Katy Rowe, Ann McCarthy and Vicki Jenner. There appeared to be a favourable response from staff.

JT: Cheshire Pension Fund – a move to encourage local authorities to divest from those companies which invest in fossil fuels

AM: encouraged members to go and see the drama "The Bundle" An Asylum Seeker's story from 7.30 – 9.00 in St Mary's Creative Space on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> Nov TG: Council done survey on air quality in CWaC and comments invited from general public. Go to cwac/lowemissionstrategy

TG also mentioned a report in The Guardian on 7 things we can all do to reduce our carbon footprint – eat less meat, investment in batteries, end use of coal, invest in renewable energy, buy electric cars, more efficient use of energy and care with forests.
