One concern came out of the meeting and that was the sale of arms to Saudi Arabia about which there were clearly conflicting opinions. Note that CAAT has a specific section within the organisation called "Converting arms to renewable". JT has been in touch with Chester CND with a view to it being involved in the meeting.

- "Fairtrade Funday" 10<sup>th</sup> March in Storyhouse. This was a very successful event with lots of people coming for tastings. One very special outcome Storyhouse now only serves Fairtrade tea, coffee, sugar and some soft drinks
