3 Report on Activities May 2020 to April 2021

One of the major concerns for CWDF has been the reduction of the international aid budget. Included in the annual report this year is reference to the Government's "Integrated Review". CWDF have 2 major concerns resulting from the review – the reduction in the aid budget and the proposal to increase the cap on the UK's nuclear weapons stockpile from 180 to 260.

Terry Green and Bernard Payne are preparing a letter to Dominic Raab expressing our grave concerns, with a copy to go to Chris Matheson, MP The meeting was asked for agreement to this letter being sent on members' behalf. There was full agreement from all present
