This handbook is a supplementary text to the Doherty Bands Handbook and is for Marching Band purposes only. All families in The Spartan Legion Marching Band should familiarize themselves with the regular Doherty Bands Handbook in addition to the policies and guidelines outlined in this text.

All changes from last year's handbook are highlighted in yellow

## General Information

Marching band is a competitive, cooperative, team activity that requires significant effort and practice. Your involvement in the band impacts everyone around you. Prior to joining, please read this section thoroughly and understand the commitment required to be a part of the marching band.

Over the summer and into the fall semester, students work to prepare a six (6) to eight (8)-minute field show performing memorized music and choreography. The Spartan Legion performs across Colorado and may travel abroad to perform and compete in any given school year.

Marching band is a physically demanding activity. Students must be able to participate in lunges, crunches, push-ups, cardiovascular, strength training, and endurance-building activities.

All Spartan Legion members must be enrolled in a concert ensemble class for the entire school year, except for color guard members who do not play a musical instrument.

## Marching Band Paperwork

Families need to have the following paperwork handed in to the Band Office before a performance spot can be issued. These forms are available at https://www.dohertybands.com/forms:

- A Commitment Form by June 2, 2023- available on the back of this handbook
- A Medical and Media Release Form by July 24, 2023
- A Fieldtrip Permission Form by July 24, 2023
- A school approved Physical Form (needs to be updated yearly) September 1, 2023


## Marching Band Fee

The marching band experience is heavily supported through the student fee, although we do enjoy significant support from the school district for transportation and instrument repairs. The participation fees for this season includes a $\$ 150$ band fee, and a $\$ 115$ performance attire fee, totaling $\$ 265$. If students already own a pair of marching shoes in good condition, the performance attire fee can be reduced to $\$ 70$, totaling $\$ 220$. These marching band fees partially cover competition and festival registration, marching-band-specific educational tools, equipment procurement, maintenance, staffing, uniforms, and show design. Fundraising may be required to supplement some remaining costs.

This year's fees are due in full by October 1, 2023. Please communicate any financial challenges with Mr. Sapienza as early as possible. We do not reject membership due to financial limitations; we want everyone to participate who wants to and are willing to work with us on individual plans as needed to cover the fee.

- \$50 payment on October 1, 2023
- $\$ 115$ or $\$ 70$ performance attire fee due by November 4, 2023

All fees are non-refundable. Changes to student rosters are very expensive as there are additional expenses to rewriting music and marching drill for our field show. Once registered for marching
band, fees are not refundable; quitting or being removed from the band program does not release you from this financial obligation. The best way to pay this and all fees is directly through the Business Office. Checks should be made payable to Doherty High School with the student's name, "Marching Band Fee 2023 payment X/3" on the memo line. You may also pay on MySchoolBucks.com under "DHS Marching Band Payments 2023-24"

## Marching Band Attendance Policy

In short: Attendance at all rehearsals, performances, and functions is mandatory and critical to the success of the Spartan Legion Marching Band!

Students are expected to attend all rehearsals, competitions, and designated activities such as football games, the homecoming bonfire, and parades. Every rehearsal involves a combination of learning new material, revising or omitting old material, and making our field show more cohesive and effective for the next performance. When students miss rehearsal, we lose invaluable time re-teaching concepts or changes, creating inconsistencies in everyone's personal performance.

New rule for 2023: If any student misses the final rehearsal before a scheduled performance for any reason, they will be required to attend the performance but may risk not being able to participate in the scheduled performance.

If you are interested in participating in other sports or activities at the school or with outside organizations, please ensure the practice and games schedule will not conflict with marching rehearsals or competitions.

Excused absences include illness (absence from school), sudden death in the family or other emergency, and/or important religious observances. Excused absences may result in a zero in the gradebook but may be eligible for a make-up assignment.

Unexcused absences include any jobs, homework, clubs, sports, activities, tutoring, and appointments. It is your responsibility to actively manage your calendar in such a way that eliminates any scheduling conflicts. Unexcused absences may result in a zero in the gradebook and are not eligible for a make-up assignment.

If you cannot attend an activity, it is your responsibility to communicate your absence, tardiness, or early departure to both your section leader and Mr. Sapienza in writing and in person, at least two weeks in advance of the scheduled event. All absences, tardiness, or early departures will be handled on a case-by-case basis but should be avoided at all costs. Excessive absences, tardiness, and early departures may result in dismissal from the marching band.

## Marching Band Schedule

The full performance and rehearsal schedule for every ensemble at Doherty High School is available on our band website www.dohertybands.com. A detailed itinerary will be provided for each performance and event no later than two weeks before the scheduled date.

Marching Band Camp is a three-week camp where we learn the music and drill of the field show. Band camp is typically held on the last week of July and the first week of August, Monday through Friday from 8:30 AM - 4:30 PM. There is a scheduled hour break for lunch at noon. Leaving campus
for lunch is a privilege and may be revoked if students do not respect timeliness or the safety of themselves and others.

The Marching Band rehearses on Mondays (student leader-guided sectionals) from 3:30-5:00, Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:45-7:00, and Saturdays from 8:00 AM-12:00 PM.

Generally, the Spartan Legion will perform at four (4) to six (6) festivals and competitions, all home football games (at Garry Berry Stadium), and may march in one (1) or more parades per school year.

We will strive to communicate schedule changes at least two weeks out, and we will not add additional rehearsals to the schedule after July 1 of each year. Any unavoidable or unexpected changes will be communicated on the website, Facebook, Band app, and email ASAP.

## Volunteering for the Marching Band and attending shows

Marching Band offers many opportunities for parent volunteers. Speak with DIME/committee leadership and Mr. Sapienza for information on how you might specifically help the Spartan Legion. Generally, we need assistance with pushing equipment, providing meals to students, prop set up and tear down, loading and driving of trucks, and various other forms of support.

Entry to marching competitions is only covered for students and staff. Family members and friends who wish to attend may be given a wrist band for field access to push equipment onto and off the field, but this does not grant access to the stands. Entry fees are typically less than $\$ 25$ per person for a full day but vary by facility. Each event will set their own admission prices. Costs will be published in our communications to you as soon as they are available from the Colorado Bandmasters Association (CBA) website (https://www.coloradobandmasters.org/about-cba).

## Meals

Food may be provided by parent volunteers at competitions and long rehearsals as resources are available. Menus will be communicated in advance so that you can choose to bring alternate options if you desire. If food will not be provided at a competition or long rehearsal, we will ensure that it is adequately communicated in advance so you may budget accordingly and bring food or concessions money. Volunteers, food, and cash donations are greatly appreciated. Please reach out to DIME for more information about supporting the Food Committee or if you are interested in helping feed the Legion.

## Marching Band Uniforms

The marching band uniform is a very expensive component of the band program. Our uniforms need to last up to ten (10) years before funds are available to replace and update them.

Uniform components include the jacket, pants with shoulder straps (bibbers), shako (headwear), shako box, plume, gauntlets, garment bag and hanger, marching shoes, and gloves. New marching shoes are available for $\$ 45$, and are typically covered under the $\$ 115$ performance attire fee. Any student who wishes to purchase new marching shoes or gloves may do so at cost. Do not store socks in the garment bag. Shoes may be held in the back zipped pocket of the garment bag.

## Marching Band Uniforms Continued

A uniform distribution meeting for students will be scheduled during the fall semester. Students are responsible for maintaining the uniform in pristine physical condition and will be held liable for damaged or lost articles. Any damage, functionality, or sizing issues must be immediately reported to Mr. Sapienza and the Uniform Committee Chair. Replacement costs for each component are listed below:

Color Guard wears a costume that is unique to each season and may have specific storage and maintenance needs. Guard members are required to purchase makeup and cosmetic items for their hair. A list will be provided by color guard staff as early in the season as possible.

## Uniform Etiquette

When wearing the uniform, you are responsible for:

- Bringing all components of the uniform to all performances
- Speaking professionally - do not use profane language
- Walking briskly in uniform - only run in absolute emergencies
- Avoiding eating food or drinking - water is permitted, and you may eat in half-uniform
- Always traveling in pairs or groups of three - never wander alone
- Removing all body jewelry while in uniform - use skin-tone studs to keep piercings from closing
- Placing long hair in a tight sock bun to fit in the shako
- Using common sense - i.e. don't polish shoes/instruments in uniform, avoid leaning or sitting on dirty surfaces, etc.

Your behavior as part of the marching band reflects not only on you, but also your team, the entire Doherty Band program, Doherty High School, and Colorado Springs School District 11. We are proud to strive to be an organization of class, respect, and sophistication. You are responsible for contributing positively to that image, including through your interactions on social media.

If you forget any component to your uniform or fail to adhere to these etiquette expectations, you may not be allowed to perform, and your Marching Band grade may be affected.

## Marching Band Specific Required Materials

For all rehearsals in addition to applicable concert band materials, students are required to bring:

- A separate backpack for marching band materials
- Music lyre and compact flip folder for music
- Quality running or tennis shoes - protect your feet!
- Hat
- Sunscreen
- Durable $1 / 2$ gallon camping-style water jug - check out Igloo and Coleman brands
- 11/2 binder with 75-100 page protectors to hold music and drill
- Pencil
- Your Smartphone Charged - we're using a new app for learning drill

For all performances, students are required to bring:

- Uniform - you are responsible for bringing all components to every performance
- Instrument/Equipment
- Form fitting athletic shirt
- Loose, but not baggy, athletic shorts/pants
- Do not wear jeans under your uniform!
- Long, at least ankle length, black socks
- Weather appropriate change of clothes for after the performance/watching other bands
- Extra reeds, valve oil, stick/guard tape (as relevant to your instrument)
- Rehearsal materials in previous lists, as communicated by Mr. Sapienza in advance


## Marching Band Grading Policy

There may also be classwork/homework assigned similarly to Concert and Jazz Ensembles.
A performance rubric will be assigned similarly to Concert and Jazz Ensembles. Please make every effort not to miss performances. In the event of an excused absence, makeup work is available, and details will be handled on a case-by-case basis.
