Rob Hughes Homily: Waiting



"I find waiting more tiring than action". So said Winston Churchill. So, I guess I'm in good company; and so are many of us, I guess, in this fast-moving world that gives us little time to be patient, and simply 'wait'.... I guess impatience may be inherited, and I'm pretty sure that most parents would agree that children don't want to wait for anything. In my family, whenever I say 'just a sec.', I still get "Aw, Dad"

from each of two sons, and each of two grandchildren!!! Does this ring any bells?

If it's true that impatience at having-to-wait follows most of us into adult-hood, we may be a bit more controlled in our response (maybe not, on occasion, when we have to queue "yet again"). That being so, not much has changed over the past two thousand years, has it?

Picture the scene recorded in Acts 1, verse 6: the account of Christ's Ascension to Heaven - an event that left the Apostles having to "wait a while" for the gift of the Holy Spirit. *So, when they had come together, they asked him, 'Lord, <u>is this the</u> <u>time</u> when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?' ⁷He replied, 'It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. In other words, 'wait until God's ready'.*

Do we ever get impatient with God? Do we sometimes pray deep down for God to give us patience **"straight away"**? If so, let's not forget that, unlike the first Apostles, we no longer have to await the Holy Spirit; He is within us, all the time. It's more likely that He will have to **wait for us to let Him in - in**to our lives and situations. But the reading tells us, in no uncertain terms, that God required the first Apostles to **wait** for the gift of the Holy Spirit, even though they seemed raring to go and get on with "doing things". Maybe most of us are much the same...

Whilst society makes every attempt to make our lives easier and faster, so that we can do more-with-less (but always at a price!!!), God works on a very different timetable. In His mind, nothing's wrong with waiting. In fact, God uses "waiting" to change things - and can use waiting time to change us, if we let Him. So, whilst we may not be comfortable with relative inactivity (in life, in worship, following prayer, whenever), we've *not* been abandoned, and we're certainly *not* helpless.

I came across this quote the other day (attributed to the theologian, John Piper): *"Waiting on the Lord is the opposite of running ahead of the Lord, and it's the opposite of bailing out on the Lord. It's staying at your appointed place while he says stay, or it's going at his appointed pace while he says go. It's not impetuous, and it's not despairing."*

Winston Churchill had something profound to say about waiting, too: he was, in fact, quoting John Milton's "Sonnet 19"), when he said: "They also serve who stand and wait". Churchill was referring to people on the British home front - giving them due credit for standing fast, and waiting for their loved ones to return, while troops fought on the battle lines.

When things don't happen soon enough (for us), we have a choice to either get angry and frustrated; or to take a deep breath, release our clenched hands because we can't "do anything at the front line" yet, and wait for opportunities, especially if we can't seem to make them (yet!). We also serve when we let God be God, and when we do what He needs us to do - at the right time (for Him). If this means "waiting", so be it, as long as whilst we wait, we do so in the certainty of His ability to give purpose to that waiting. So, if we're tempted to pray "Lord, give me patience, now", maybe we could, instead, pray for humility and trust:

Humility comes when we remember that God is the one who put us here, especially when we find ourselves getting impatient and frustrated with Him or with other people.

Trust is about being aware of at least two things about God;

- Awareness of His Power, which means that we accept that He cares about everything that's happening.
- Awareness that His *Love for us* means that there is care and purpose behind everything that happens good and bad.

Waiting may well be counter-intuitive for us today - especially when we might "want to get busy" and "do something constructive". Maybe we might expect God to intervene and do something as well. But **He's already doing something.** In this ever-changing, and increasingly-complex and dangerous world, patiently waiting may be a means by which we're now being prepared to live our lives in a different, better way that's closer to God's way. He may well be helping us do this by saying "wait a bit longer".

The Christian author, Joyce Meyer, wrote this: "Patience is not simply the ability to wait. It's how we behave while waiting."

So, we pray:

God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change; Courage to change the things I can; and wisdom to know the difference. Living one day at a time; enjoying one moment at a time; accepting hardships as the pathway to peace; Taking, as He did, this sinful world as it is, not as I would have it; Trusting that He will make things right if I surrender to His Will; So that I may be reasonably happy in this life and supremely happy with Him forever in the next.
