# Rob Hughes Homily - Seeing is Believing?



There were two people lost in the blazing desert sun, and close to collapse through thirst... then suddenly, one of them noticed their possible salvation! "Is that a mirage, or are my eyes deceiving me?"

This isn't as daft as it sounds! If we were to ask this question to a sample

group of people, many would say that a mirage isn't real. In fact, however, the image perceived by the eye is **entirely** real! They actually see-what-they-see - a blue, shimmering in the distance, which does indeed, look like water. It's the interpretation of an optical illusion made by the brain that's inaccurate... What the viewer makes of the mirage is just refraction of the blue sky, reflected off the sand... but it's certainly not water.

The Stoic philosopher, Marcus Aurelius Antonius, was the last of the Five "good emperors of Rome" (he reigned from 161 to 180 AD). He had a profound knowledge of "the human mind" - and about reality, thoughts and over-thinking, and said this: "Everything we hear is an opinion, not a fact. Everything we see is a perspective, not the truth."

Wow! According to Marcus Aurelius, everything we see is no more, no less, than our own perspective - which need not always be a perspective shared by others. And what we hear is just someone else's, or our own, opinion - not necessarily 'absolute truth'.

We have just celebrated the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost - a time in the Christian calendar that might prompt believers to say "WOW", and more likely prompt non-believers, or waverers, to ask "HOW". The Biblical account in the Book of the Acts of the Apostles says this:

"When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them".

Most certainly the New Testament account tells us about the facts as perceived by the apostles. Their perspective may well be the subject of academic debate forever, but the profound effect it had on them is beyond any doubt whatsoever (I'd encourage you to read Acts 2 in full, but it states this: "Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles").

Having been emboldened by the fact of the resurrection of Jesus, the disciples became totally courageous in exercising their mission As Apostles, they were no longer followers of Jesus, the man, but (and to quote the dictionary): 'vigorous and pioneering advocates and supporters of a particular policy, idea, or cause'.

They had now become absolutely committed, and absolutely fearless, in their subsequent ministries. Jesus was no longer with them in body, but they now drew strength and purpose form His presence, in the person of The Holy Spiritwithin. In a way, Christ's Ascension had been a necessary event before believers could have ever fully depended upon the support of the Holy Spirit within them (and within us all).

Before, since and throughout my volunteer ministry, I've had numerous discussions with non-believers and waverers who claimed to still be seeking to find (having, so they say, failed to find) God. The truth is difficult to explain to people who find this truth a bit too much to take: that although God is everywhere, and every-when, we don't have to seek Him out, we have to 'let Him out'.

By that I mean allow ourselves quiet times to simply 'be' with Him; dedicated to him; be available to Him; and so, become sensitive to His presence. That's incredibly difficult in a world and society subject to a constant avalanche of information over social media and the TV! Much of it is opinion, speculation and downright mischief...

Going back to Marcus Aurelius quote' - what we hear is just opinion (all-too-often someone else's)! And what we see and perceive is subject to our immediate interpretation - and not necessarily the only interpretation.

That's why it's important for us to 'weigh things up' before reacting to what appears to be happening around us at any given time. Immediate, knee-jerk reactions (except to an immediate threat to life or safety) can so easily be based on mis-interpretation of what we think we're seeing or hearing about. What has happened has happened (nothing we can say, or do, or worry about can alter that); what 'is now', is the only thing we can move on from, and **how** we move on is totally under our control guided by the Holy Spirit.

The Apostles took the fact of the Ascension at face value; they couldn't explain it - they didn't feel a need to understand 'how', but simply rejoice at the wow. As it was the culmination of so many other miracles, they had been party-to, they simply accepted 'the Holy Spirit within' as a fact, and that enabled them to move on.

I'd suggest that it's pretty much impossible for believers to be fully aware of the presence of 'God within' all the time. But it's entirely possible to still our minds, for a few moments, a few times during most days, to simply 'be'. I'll leave you with a couple of challenges; ask yourselves or a loved one:

"Who am I?"

In responding, how many would answer with their name

"What am I"

How many would answer without mentioning, for example, being a mother, or father, or a <job title>?

The challenge is this - just try answering "I am" ... and leave it there. That's what I mean by simply 'being' - having no thoughts about anything in particular; no opinions about anything; no 'what-if-ing', no 'why', no 'how'. Simply be silent with God, and let Him respond from within. Taking it as a matter of fact and faith that He is within, and simply being grateful for that.

# Puritan "Outrage" at Eccleston / Who were the Puritans?

This article written by Peter Jackson originally appeared in the May 2010 Parish Church Newsletter.

The Puritans first came to prominence in the reign of Elizabeth I, and have been described as "advanced Protestants" who believed that the Reformation had not gone far enough in its separation from the Church of Rome. The viewpoint at that time was probably understandable, bearing in mind the "roller-coaster" attitudes of the Tudors and, more particularly the excesses of the reign of Mary I ("Bloody Mary"). Her marriage to Philip of Spain, the leading European Catholic, had meant that, should she have a son and heir who would succeed, then the reversion to Catholicism in England would be unavoidable. But it was not to be and Elizabeth I, on her accession, steadied the ship.

The Puritans, however still harboured fears when, in 1603, the Tudor dynasty was replaced by the Stuarts, whom they regarded as "covert Catholics". There was some truth in this. Charles II's death bed conversion, and his brother, James II's subsequent exile after attempting, by stringent means, to restore Catholicism, add credence to the Puritan viewpoint.

The purer form of worship desired by the Puritans meant that they abhorred anything which reminded them of the Church of Rome. Hence idolatrous images, wall paintings, relics and *even stained-glass* were all anathema to them. One highly visible example was the crosses which had, since the medieval period, been a feature of the village scene. Such crosses, up to 25 feet high, were elaborately carved. Some had been set up on wayside sites, and others, usually more elaborately carved, in churchyards. The wayside crosses were used as public proclamation points, for trading, as signposts and in some cases as boundary markers.

An example of such a cross may now be seen at the junction of the A51 (Tarvin Road) and Hare Lane. This has been erected by the good offices of Littleton Parish Council to commemorate the Millennium and to replace the original wayside cross (Vicars Cross) which was vandalized, broken down and destroyed in 1613.

Who were the vandals? Ormerod's History refers to what might be termed a "Puritan cell" whose leader was alleged to be one of John Bruin of Stapleford, and whose members included his employees and acquaintances. This cell set out to destroy crosses throughout the Country and City. There were four wayside crosses (at Delamere Forest, Tarvin, Christleton and Eccleston). All were broken down and vandalized in 1613.

We known from the documents of the Court of Star Chamber the names of those allegedly responsible for the Eccleston outrages.



In evidence, a man named Dale admitted that he destroyed Eccleston Churchyard Cross "leaving the foundation as sufficient for any civil use" [A note is necessary regarding the Court of Star Chamber. Introduced in 1487, it dispensed with juries. It could punish by fines, imprisonment and mutilation, but not by death (odd, in such bloodthirsty times). It became tyrannical and was abolished in 1641.

Are there any traces left of the 2 Eccleston crosses? Any remnant of the cross, possibly situated where the Pump House now stands, may have disappeared during the extensive restoration of the village in the second half of the 19<sup>th</sup> Century. If any reader has knowledge of any remnants of the crosses, I would be glad to know. Meanwhile, I am continuing to research the outcome of the star chamber trial.

# Reader/Intercessor/Sidesperson Rota

At the last PCC meeting it was suggested that Eccleston Church return to having a sidesperson. It was suggested that either the reader or prayer lead for the service act as sidesperson to make things easy. If someone is already available to read then it saves having to try and organize an additional rota for sidespeople.

Duties of the sidesperson include

- greeting people as they enter the church
- handing out hymn books/service sheets and collecting them at the end of a service.
- inviting people to communion (for Holy Communion Services)
- recording the total number in the congregation.
- Putting the correct hymn numbers in the hymn boards.
- Taking the plate money to the vestry for counting.


