Inter Library Loan Service (ILL): EC Library – EDCs

EC Library accepts requests only by recognized libraries and documentation services - not by individuals!

Type of material:

- **Print books** may be borrowed unless they are restricted to library use only (maximum loan period of **six weeks**)
- **Periodicals** cannot be loaned but the EC Library can supply copies subject to copyright regulation and not to commercial use
- **E-books** cannot be loaned due to licensing restrictions

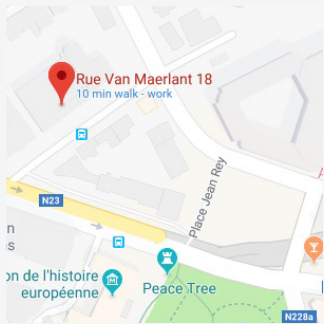

THE POWER OF METADATA

The publications produced by the EU institutions, agencies and other bodies are identified and made available to the public through the Publications Office of the European Union. Centralised access to all of this content is provided via the EU Publications website, where audiences can download publications in PDF or eBook format, or order print copies.

As information professionals, there is no longer a need to have physical or electronic copies of publications in your collections; however, you do need to be able to integrate metadata into these collections and provide links to content which is stored elsewhere in electronic format. This creation of virtual libraries expands collections beyond physical library walls and offers clients comprehensive coverage in predefined subject areas.

For several years now, the Publications Office has been offering access to the metadata of its publication collection through various means, among them its online public access catalogue (OPac).



THE OPAC

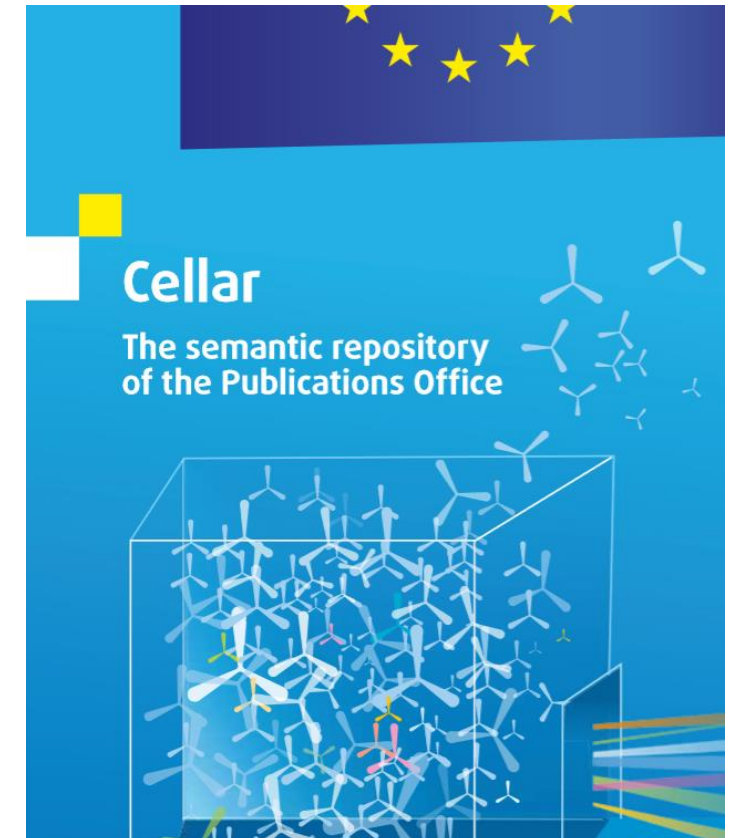


OPac is a self-service system for accessing metadata which has been available since 2011 <http://opac.publications.europa.eu>. The catalogue currently contains more than 320 000 individual bibliographical records, available for searching and downloading. This service does not require any registration.

OPac offers you different search options using specific fields such as author, title or subject. You can also apply filters to search queries, with options including language and format. Once you have your
