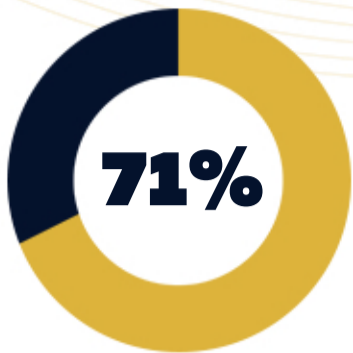


IS REMOTE WORK IMPROVING EMPLOYEE PRODUCTIVITY?

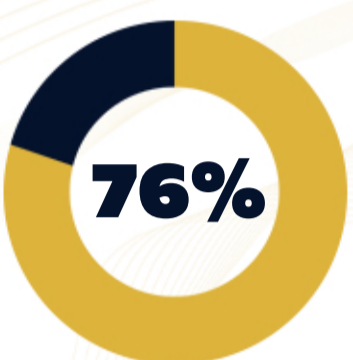


...of employers say that remote work has either boosted or has made no difference to productivity. (CIPD)

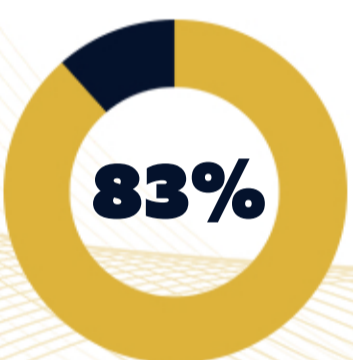


GLOBALWORKPLACEANALYTICS.COM REPORTS THAT:

...of employees say they're more productive when working remotely because they experience fewer distractions (FLEXJOBS)

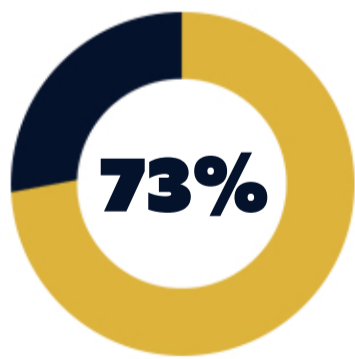

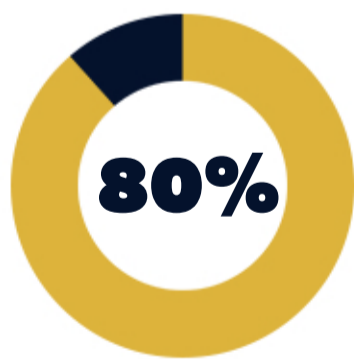


WHAT MIGHT THE FUTURE OF REMOTE WORK LOOK LIKE?

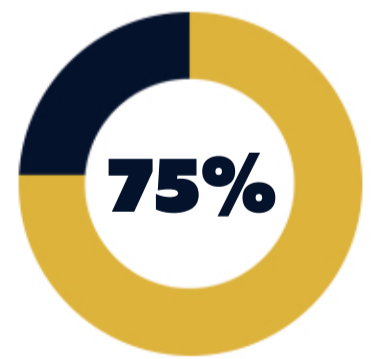
Remote work emerged as a necessity during lockdown, but is it here to stay? Productivity has been shown to increase, but what other factors are at play? Let's look at some more numbers.
