



Vacancies for focused (non-rotating) companion animal internships in the field of reproduction

Job description: This position is replacement until end of September 2024. It may be suitable for candidates seeking more experience in a particular field of companion animal medicine, possibly in preparation of a residency program (EBVS).

The Clinical Department of Companion Animals ensures the operation of a hospital receiving first-line (10%) and referred (90%) cases as well as a continuous emergency service (24 hours a day and 365 days a year), caring for a total of approximately 15,000 cases per year. In addition, it provides clinical education for veterinary medicine students and training of graduates in various veterinary medicine specializations recognized at European level (EBVS). Further, the clinic supports clinical research in various fields of veterinary science (for a virtual visit of our hospital: https://www.cvu.uliege.be/cms/c_4759990/fr/cvu-visite-virtuelle).

Required Qualifications: The candidate will have to:

- Hold a diploma in veterinary medicine recognized within the European Union or deemed equivalent
- Have the right to be registered or to be eligible for registration with the Belgian Veterinary Order
- Have completed a rotating companion animal internship

As the number of places available is limited, candidates will be selected by a committee on the combination of the submitted file and an interview. Among the selection criteria, a knowledge deemed sufficient of the French and/or English languages in order to communicate effectively with students and colleagues is considered.

The program is carried out under the supervision of European specialists among which 6 ECVIM-CA diplomates including 5 internists and a cardiologist; 5 ECVS diplomates; 2 ECVAAs diplomates; 2 ECVO diplomates; 1 ECVN diplomate; 2 ECAR diplomates; 5 ECVDI diplomates; 1 ECVD diplomate; 1 ECVECC diplomate; 1 ECVCN diplomate.

The intern will participate in the management of patients admitted to reproductive and obstetrical consultations, as well as surgical procedures and on-call duty. He/she will be actively involved in the supervision of students, including primary care consultations at the Prince Laurent Foundation.
