Operate Four Unity as a hub, offering light refreshments, snacks and merchandise appropriate for the community whilst providing a safe space for individuals to relax, get advice, information, support and barrier contraception.

Provide various support & social groups to improve the mental, emotional, physical & sexual health of individuals through peer education & support.

Facilitate events throughout the year bringing the community together, building relationships and reducing isolation whilst providing educational & informational materials.

Offer 1-2-1 support when requested and establish pathways and referrals to needed services, improving the overall health & wellbeing of each individual.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

Four Pillars struggled at the beginning of the year after being rejected for several funding grants. This led to a re-think of the organisation's structure and finance income. A SoS campaigned helped bridge the gap in funding that was denied and a reduction in staff and some services meant we were able to keep our doors open.

Through this the charity has continued to grow its service user base with 414 new service users visiting us in the period. Our overall engagement reach was 3943 with an additional 2751 people reached through events and awareness campaigns. In total Four Pillars supported approximately 110 people every month across the year.

Financial review

Four Pillars' policy is to hold a minimum 3 months reserves which represents 3 months of fixed costs.

The charity has been building on this over the last few years and believes it has in place the necessary funds to cover 3 months of fixed costs.
