Democracy and social justice campaigner Gina Miller unveils roadmap to 'happier and healthier' Epsom and Ewell

- Epsom and Ewell constituency to become a 'national blueprint' for a progressive new 'Wellbeing Economy.'
- Dynamic plan to save local high streets by increasing entrepreneur tax relief and replacing outdated business rates
- New wellbeing hubs to boost mental and physical health

DEMOCRACY campaigner Gina Miller has unveiled a revolutionary plan to make Epsom and Ewell the UK's first 'Wellbeing Economy' district – to radically improve the health, happiness, and wellbeing of every local citizen.

The charismatic businesswoman – best known for twice beating the government in court over legal challenges to Brexit – announced her pioneering strategy at a launch event at Epsom Social yesterday evening, where she set out her roadmap to make the constituency "happier, healthier, and more hopeful."

Miller is standing against the Tory 'rising star' Mhari Fraser in the next general election. Miller has declared that stopping her Trump-supporting, Trussonomics-endorsing opponent from getting into Westminster will be the "fight of her life."

The exciting new proposals unveiled in Epsom would ensure all policy decisions are approached through the lens of health, and happiness and wellbeing, ensure the prosperity and sustainability of the local community.

Outlining the benefits of a Wellbeing Economy, Miller told attendees: "Our country faces profound challenges. Almost every sector and every region are suffering and needs fixing. The convergence of crises we face call for more than political stunts or policy tinkering and tweaks. The state of our communities and country demands a fundamental shift in the very foundation of our economic system. This is much more than a U-turn, but it begins with Epsom and Ewell turning to the True & Fair party."

Central to Miller's vision is the revitalisation of local high streets, long voted a top priority for Surrey residents. The True & Fair leader is calling for the introduction of Wellbeing community hubs to offer essential services such as respite, childcare, healthcare, and financial advice in a single place. Alongside this, Miller plans for the outdated business rates system to be overhauled, allowing for vital community services to operate without the heavy added tax burden.

The True & Fair Party has proposed the hubs would be partially run by volunteers who would earn 'community vouchers,' and called for the retirement age to be reduced to 60 to allow residents to become part of a caring, local community workforce.

Mental and physical health support provided at the proposed hubs are central to Miller's emphasis shift from reactive to preventative medical care, a strategy she says will relieve pressure on the NHS, which she says is overwhelmed and reduced to an "emergency service."





Alongside this, Miller's vision will see radical workplace reforms to help employers prioritise staff 'health and happiness'. Initiatives such as more flexible work arrangements, mental health days, and access to health MOTs, and counselling services would be rolled out as standard. Miller has also called for an increase of free childcare hours to be given to low-income families.

In addition to community services, True & Fair has also set out a plan to help attract and keep businesses on the high street. In a move supported by many local businesses, the Party proposes that business rates are replaced by a scaled transaction tax to level the playing field with online companies, plus entrepreneur tax relief to be raised to £15m, and for a review to be carried out into relief on vacant land and properties, and a landlord register.

The launch event at Epsom Social is a milestone moment in Miller's campaign to become Epsom and Ewell's MP in the next general election, with a series of local events planned for the coming weeks and months across the constituency.

Gina Miller, who is also Leader of the True & Fair Party, added: "The people of Epsom and Ewell have a proud tradition of standing up for what is right, and I am calling on them now to make a positive change at both a local and national level.

It is clear to everyone that it's time to fight for a fairer country. To be proud to be British and rebuild our international reputation and respect. To become a more hopeful, happier country where we celebrate what binds us, not what divides us. Just one True & Fair voice in parliament can help make this happen and the people of Epsom and Ewell can make this happen.

A thriving economy, fit for the future, should prioritise its people. We can do this through collaborative partnerships and innovative policies in our local area. My vision is for Epsom and Ewell to serve as a blueprint to pave the way forward for the rest of the country, to stand as an example of how a Wellbeing Economy can simultaneously encourage economic growth and allow the people of Epsom and Ewell to flourish."

The True & Fair Party was set up in 2021 and has five candidates who will fight for seats in the next election. Gina Miller will be standing against the Conservatives in Chris Grayling's current Epsom and Ewell seat. For more information visit: www.ginaforepsom.vote
