Clause 1: Introduction

This work instruction outlines the requirements to accept a third-party HCB other than HQC during an assessment, supplier approval, or documentation verification.

As several authorities over the world are implementing their own policies or requirements, it has become difficult to have a harmonized list of approved HCBs, which is why this work instruction will try to outline the most suitable process possible as of this version's date. In some cases, an HCB is only approved within its country of legal registration.

Clause 2: Segments

All customers of HQC, when providing a third-party HCB to be approved, must provide an HCB which may comply with one of the following segments below:

Segment C Accredited by a mutual accepted Halal authority			
Segment E	Request for approval by your HQC contact person [if A/B/C do not apply]

Segment D

If the third-party HCB is not applicable to Segments A, B, or C, an e-mail should be sent to your contact person providing the Halal Certificate of the HCB, after which a review will be conducted, followed by a decision from an authorized HQC employee.

Please note: A third-party HCB must have an appendix mentioning the approved products.

Clause 3: Scope of Approvals

Due to a broad field of categories that are applicable to become Halal certified, there are restrictions to accept a third-party HCB. One of these restrictions is that parties as mentioned in Segments B and C may limit the scope of activities of an HCB, which is described in their certificate issued.

Example:

Party A may have an accreditation, but limited to only chemicals and dairy, meaning that all other types of products may not be approved upon, limiting their acceptance level.

If a third-party HCB is dismissed, the reason will be clarified and specified towards the customer.

The category table of applicable scopes can be found in Clause 6.

General Halal Certificate	A certificate issued by the HCB awarded to the

Halal Shipment Certificate	A certificate issued by the HCB for a specific
	shipment of an approved manufacturer.
	Usually used for slaughtering houses which export
	fresh meats.
	It should mention the producer, importer, exporter,
	health certificate number [if applicable], quantities
	in kilograms or litres, production and expiry dates,
	product description, a valid signature, and a
	reference number.
Halal Statement or Declaration	A document issued by the HCB declaring that a
	process or premise is declared as Halal-suitable or
	Halal-compliant.
	It should contain the name and address of the
	premise as well as the approved products, date of
	issue and expiry, and a signature and reference
	number.
