The good shepherd and his sheep

'Very truly I tell you Pharisees, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate, but climbs in by some other way, is a thief and a robber. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep listen to his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes on ahead of them, and his sheep follow him because they know his voice. But they will never follow a stranger; in fact, they will run away from him because they do not recognise a stranger's voice.' Jesus used this figure of speech, but the Pharisees did not understand what he was telling them.

Therefore Jesus said again, 'Very truly I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who have come before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep have not listened to them. I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. They will come in and go out, and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.

Thanksgiving and Prayer

As we head towards the season of Advent and the festival of Christmas a truly warm welcome (in every sense) awaits everyone at St Mary's thanks to the new heating system and so much more. The ground floor of the tower has been transformed and now contains long awaited toilet facilities as well as a stunning new mezzanine room. In the main body of the church the nave floor has been re-varnished and is much more in keeping with the rest of the building. The font has been moved to a more central location and a new refreshment area has been installed. Huge thanks are due to Dave Scott, Joel and the team who have worked tirelessly on these projects as well as carrying out unseen but essential infrastructure work such as mains water and sewerage, rewiring, installing a data network and making structurally sound the beams that support the ringing chamber.

The work so far will be celebrated in a service of dedication in the Spring. This service will be a time of thanksgiving to God and a dedication of all the work carried out. There is still some way to go: in early 2019 we will be making the important addition of an up-to-date audio-visual system. Further stages which will help us make full use of the new facilities will involve installing safety double glazing in the mezzanine room so that it can be used as more than a storage area and creating a children's area in the south west corner of the nave. Although the overall cost of the work so far is coming in very near to our original budget despite significant extra work being necessary, the combined cost of the latter two projects is estimated to be a further £53,000. We will also have to repay the Archdeacons Loan of £50,000.

A heartfelt thank you to all those whose generous giving has made possible the realisation of the Heart for The Community Project so far. When you see what has been achieved, we know you will want to see the next stages completed and to feel a part of the legacy we are establishing for future generations with the first major refurbishment of St Mary's in over 100 years.

The above wording reflects such a small part of the whole project. In January this year when the boiler room flooded, we were left wondering how we would progress with the work. It is a testament to prayer and generosity of money and of time, that we are in this amazing position of being blessed with our new facilities. I am so very grateful to the skills of Dave and Joel and the team and especially to Ian Burns and Tim Jackson who have led this project forward on behalf of St Mary's. I also want to thank my Standing Committee who have also met regularly on site and prayerfully made decisions together. This includes, Ian, Tim, Kathy and Linda.

You may have noticed that each week the church has been tidied and swept clean, chairs moved and made to feel welcoming even when there have been thick layers of dust. I especially want to thank Kathy for all her care in this respect. Also to Graham and Linda for the moving of chairs and making sure St Mary's is warm and welcoming to all. All of us in this church will benefit from the warmth and the new facilities in the years ahead.


