



TRINITY CAFÉ COLEMANS HATCH



Trinity café has come a long way since we started in 2015. We have now become a regular meeting place, for local people and neighbouring villages.

We have grown over the years and have developed the café into a well-established venue with a sociable and hospitable atmosphere. In summer we have outdoor seating with gazebos and parasols.

With Cafes every second and fourth Thursday of each month, we have made a lot of new friends and have added more events to our diary. We can be found at our annual church fete every May, followed in June with "Jazz on the Lawn", where you are invited to bring friends and family for a summer evening picnic with music.

Last year we held a magnificent event for the Platinum Jubilee of her late Majesty The Queen, this year, we will hold a Coronation Lunch for His Majesty King Charles 111. The latest addition to our calendar is our monthly Trinity Talks where we invite a local resident to come along to give us a talk on a subject of interest from their life. The evening starts at 5.45 with nibbles and wine, the talk begins at 6pm and lasts 45 minutes with time for questions afterwards.

As we approach the Christmas season our café is suitably decorated and we enjoy the season's fayre of mince pies and cakes with a carol or two by the Christmas Tree.

Throughout the year we offer freshly made, home-baked cakes and pastries, delivered on the morning of our café. Hot chocolate, squash, fresh coffee, and a choice of teas all served in our collection of vintage china. We do not

have a price list; all donations are divided between our locally chosen charity and the upkeep of Trinity Hall. All are welcome and we have an area for children with books and toys. The cafe is the hub of Coleman's Hatch and all are welcome.


