

Matthew 5: 13-20

Salt and Light

13 "You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot.

14 "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. 15 Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. 16 In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.

The Fulfillment of the Law

17 "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them. 18 For truly I tell you, until heaven and earth disappear, not the smallest letter, not the least stroke of a pen, will by any means disappear from the Law until everything is accomplished. 19 Therefore anyone who sets aside one of the least of these commands and teaches others accordingly will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever practices and teaches these commands will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. 20 For I tell you that unless your righteousness surpasses that of the Pharisees and the teachers of the law, you will certainly not enter the kingdom of heaven.

<u>Isaiah 58: 1-9</u>

"Shout it aloud, do not hold back.
Raise your voice like a trumpet.

Declare to my people their rebellion
and to the descendants of Jacob their sins.

For day after day they seek me out;
they seem eager to know my ways,
as if they were a nation that does what is right
and has not forsaken the commands of its God.

They ask me for just decisions and seem eager for God to come near them.

- 3 'Why have we fasted,' they say, 'and you have not seen it? Why have we humbled ourselves, and you have not noticed?'
- "Yet on the day of your fasting, you do as you please and exploit all your workers.
- 4 Your fasting ends in quarrelling and strife, and in striking each other with wicked fists.
- You cannot fast as you do today and expect your voice to be heard on high.
- 5 Is this the kind of fast I have chosen, only a day for people to humble themselves?
- Is it only for bowing one's head like a reed and for lying in sackcloth and ashes?
- Is that what you call a fast, a day acceptable to the Lord?
- 6 "Is not this the kind of fasting I have chosen:
- to loose the chains of injustice and untie the cords of the yoke,
- to set the oppressed free and break every yoke?
- 7 Is it not to share your food with the hungry and to provide the poor wanderer with shelter—
- when you see the naked, to clothe them, and not to turn away from your own flesh and blood?
- 8 Then your light will break forth like the dawn, and your healing will quickly appear;
- then your righteousness will go before you, and the glory of the Lord will be your rear guard.
- Then you will call, and the Lord will answer; you will cry for help, and he will say: Here am I.
- "If you do away with the yoke of oppression, with the pointing finger and malicious talk,

Some news from Tim Jackson

I am taking part in a programme run by Chichester Diocese to become an Authorised Lay Minister. There are two elements that I am taking - Worship and Liturgy, and Preaching.

The Worship and Liturgy module involves five study days and aims to give a practical and theoretical grounding in the different aspects of planning and leading worship. The course is based in Hove and there are 24 people taking part. They are of a wide range of backgrounds and come from all over the diocese and from a wide variety of church traditions. So far I have attended one session which was stimulating.

When authorised I am permitted to lead all or part of noneucharistic worship, but not preach, under the supervision of Julie, or if she is not available then in agreement with the wardens.

The module on preaching will take place remotely and has not started yet. It aims to provide a practical introduction to preaching. Once completed I am authorised to preach six times a year in the benefice.

These modules complement the Theology, Ministry and Mission degree that I completed in 2021. It means that I will then have the diocesan approval to help in worship and so assist Julie on Sunday mornings and on other occasions.

I will be formally commissioned at Chichester Cathedral at 2.00 pm on Saturday, 29th April. Please do come along.

It will be a privilege to be able to lead and to preach in this community.



Events in the Diocese



2023 will be kept as a **Year of the Old Testament** and 2024 as a **Year of the New Testament**.

These will prepare us for a special **Year of Faith** in 2025 which marks both 1700 years of the Council of Nicaea and 950 years of Christian mission in the diocese based in Chichester.

The Year of the Old Testament will include:

- •A series of seminars to be conducted online which will look at various books of the Bible such as Exodus, the Psalms, the Song of Songs and Isaiah, with some added sessions for those who would like to take their study to a deeper level. (Details to be confirmed in the New Year)
- And finally a fortnightly online book group on the first two books of the Bible: 'Reading Genesis and Exodus as Christian Scripture for Today's Church'.
