

Responding to God's Generosity

First, thank you to everyone for their support to St Mary's, whether it is through prayer, time or financially.

During Lent everyone is being asked to review their response to God's generosity to us. As the Holiday Club learnt: "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." (John 3:16) What a wonderful gift! We live in a world created by God, and it is His creation that we care for, and it is His that we return to Him in our giving.

At the start of the year we reviewed our Mission Action Plan copies of which are available in church. This document sets out our hope and ambitions for 2023. Two weeks ago a Congregation Briefing on the parish's income and expenditure in 2022 was circulated which set the context for those plans. If you want to know more please ask.

During Lent we are praying and thinking about our giving in all forms with a short reminder at each of the services.

This week we look in more detail at the ways we can give financial support to St Mary's.

The best method by far is the Parish Giving Scheme ("PGS"). You can give through PGS either on a regular or a one-off basis. The best way to do so is via their website which explains how PGS works and the giving page is: https://www.parishgiving.org.uk/donors/setting-up-your-gift/ To make a gift you also need our PGS Parish Number which is 103060484. If you dislike doing things on-line paper forms are available in church, just ask. PGS is particularly good as they take care of all the Gift Aid administration.

You can also give via the donation station at the back of the church using a contactless payment card.

If you wish to give by cash, there is the offertory plate just as you enter via the tower door. If you can donate using Gift Aid please complete one of the blue envelopes. If you are in church during the week there is also the alms box by the south door.

Longer term, if you are estate planning please consider making a legacy to the church.
