
Newsletter 9<sup>th</sup> July 2023



Dear Friends,

In the month of May, Trevor and I took a trip to Scotland.

Using 'Gabrielle' our camper car, we took the slow road to the Isle of Skye via the Lake District. We had planned the trip in December in the hope the weather would be good enough for camping and walking.

The day we arrived at Lake Windermere, the rain was pelting down and very grey. We sat in our camper and wondered if we had made the right decision. The weather app for Cornwall was showing full sunshines! However, the following morning the sun came out and we were blessed with sunshine nearly every day.

One of the main reasons for travelling to Scotland was to visit the place of my birth. My parents had a house built near Loch Lomond where I had lived for the first two years of my life. We continued on up to the Isle of Skye, a trip I will never forget.

Since returning, I have had time to reflect on that moment in Helensburgh. A place where love and family life had been built all those years ago. A part of my life from the past. So often we leave the really important conversations to one side. We think we will have time to talk about them another day but that isn't always the case.

## Psalm 143: 8

# The Prayer of Faith

<sup>13</sup> Is anyone among you in trouble? Let them pray. Is anyone happy? Let them sing songs of praise. <sup>14</sup> Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. <sup>15</sup> And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up. If they have sinned, they will be forgiven. <sup>16</sup> Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective.

<sup>17</sup> Elijah was a human being, even as we are. He prayed earnestly that it would not rain, and it did not rain on the land for three and a half years. <sup>18</sup> Again he prayed, and the heavens gave rain, and the earth produced its crops.

Psalm Roar Sussex - 14th October 2023 St Mary the Virgin, Warbleton 10am-4pm A DAY OF ROBUST, JOYFUL, VIGOROUS PSALM-SINGING

Singing psalms is commanded by God. It is part of a life filled with the Holy Spirit. We join our voices with Christ, our heavenly Worship Leader. If doctrine strengthens our minds, psalm-singing fortifies our hearts. Do not imagine the gentle singing of a choir in a cathedral. Picture a rugby team about to go onto the pitch, or an army preparing for battle. Jesus is the Lion of Judah and this will be a day to roar the Psalms

This will be a day on why and how to sing the Psalms, with lots of singing. We'll try singing the psalms to well-known metrical hymn tunes, in four parts, in a Genevan style, and using Anglican chant. The emphasis is on enthusiastic participation rather than musical perfection. No prior music knowledge required
