

30 years ago, in March 1994, the first women were ordained as priests, some had been ordained as Deacons before this while many had previously ministered as Deaconesses. In the Diocese of Chichester, the ordinations took place on 15 May 1994 at St Swithun's, East Grinstead. In celebration of this anniversary and in thanksgiving to God for the priestly ministry of women, the Cathedral is planning a portrait exhibition of all the women serving as priests in the Diocese today. The exhibition will run from late April to May culminating in a celebration service on Monday 13th May.

I received an email asking me to send in a current photo and to answer some questions in preparation for the exhibition. I found the whole exercise very challenging as I have always believed it is so important for both men and women to be seen to flourish together in ministry.

The exhibition begins by highlighting our story, and ministry both past and present. It is about celebrating the strength, diversity, and journey of faith, reflecting on the progress made and inspiring a future generation of the church. I so often forget that the ordination of women is still very new in the life of the church.

As I began to write; I found myself looking back with thankfulness. The very fact that God would call me to be ordained in the Church of England, has always reminded me that God is a God of surprises. Having grown up in a family that did not go to church and where I thought it was only men who could be Vicar's; it was an incredible moment in my life to have that sense of vocation confirmed.

I recently celebrated ten years in the parishes of Hartfield and Coleman's Hatch. It has been a privilege to serve across the benefice and to be Rural Dean of Rotherfield. To see both churches flourish alongside and within their communities. We have come through a Pandemic together with all its incredible moments of community and huge sorrows. I have always made it clear that the church is not the building it is the people. We have our lovely church buildings but they should not contain what the church is there for. A place of worship. A place of hope and purpose. A place of love; peace and prayer where anyone can come and receive the gift of God's love in an extended family. We might gather on a Sunday but then we take God's Word, grace and love out into the world.

My own sense of calling was slow and at times resistant but surrounded by prayer; amazing family; good friends and a willingness to open to the call of my Heavenly Father. God is a God of surprises and for that I am incredibly thankful.
