

This month sees us holding our Village Fete at Colemans' Hatch in the grounds of Holy Trinity on the 11th May from 1pm.

You may become aware that various projects are underway at Holy Trinity. After many years where we have navigated pot holes across the car park, we are having the surface redone.

We are also having a new bi-fold door with ramp and steps from the rear part of Trinity Hall. This will enable us to use the hall for more events and enjoy the terrace and the beautiful views. It will also give us a better fire escape.

Our old boiler is not expected to complete another winter. We are therefore having some under pew heating fitted to enable us to keep the people warm next winter for our regular services, events and all our baptisms, weddings and funerals.

Our final project which is currently in for planning permission, is to extend the churchyard into the 'rectors' field. This is really important for us as a church to make sure we care for families and loved ones both now and in the future. We will let you know once the permission has been given. We hope to hold a special service in September to give thanks for the many blessings we have received over this past year. We hope you will feel your parish church in Coleman's Hatch is being cared for both now and for future generations. Please do come and join us at our events or services in both churches.

ST MARY'S DEVELOPMENT 2024

St Mary's stands at the heart of our community and is so important to us as a village - as it has been for centuries.

It is now six years since the Heart for the Community project transformed how the village could make use of the church building. Regular users of the building now include the school, the Church Street Community Café, the Little Stars toddler and carers group and one-off users such as HARTS, a children's holiday club and community suppers.

Time, however, moves on and a regular architect's inspection of the church identified urgent repairs are required to the stone work, particularly around some windows. Repair of these windows and replacement of rainwater goods and other repair work has had to start immediately. **The cost of these works is £100,000**.

In addition, there are repairs required to the Lychgate Cottage and various projects already identified to further improve the facilities within the church for community use, especially our childrens area, improvements for our school visits, improved accessability for our older visitors and heating & security improvements. The church community has already raised about £75,000 from donations and grants, including from the Sussex Historic Churches Trust but we would like to **raise an additional £100,000**, making a total of £175,000 to help us complete this vital work.

New Associate Vicar for Cowden


After nearly five years of praying and discussion, I am delighted to announce a new Associate House for Duty Vicar for Cowden. Rev Stephen Hills. (Please see photo and his short biography below).

His appointment and licensing is subject to DBS checks but we are hopeful to hold a licensing service in early July.

Stephen will be Associate Vicar for the church in Cowden working 2.5 days a week. He will live in the Rectory in Cowden and is really looking forward to meeting everyone. In order for Stephen to be Associate Vicar, Rev Julie will become Priest in Charge of Cowden but will continue to be Rector of Hartfield and Coleman's Hatch.

I am looking forward to working with Stephen in the months ahead. This is such an answer to prayer for all of us. Please pray for Stephen and Elizabeth as they prepare to leave their parishes of Bidborough and Southborough after 25 years.

Stephen has spent his 25 years of ordained ministry in Southborough and Bidborough. As Curate at Christ Church he launched a new service at St Peter's Church on Southborough Common, and was able to continue to lead there when St Lawrence Bidborough joined the Southborough Team Ministry and Stephen became Team Vicar. A few years ago the parishes were re-configured, and Stephen became Rector of St Lawrence's and St Peter's.

Earlier in adult life, Stephen worked in the City for some years, before sensing a call to train for ministry. He and Elizabeth spent a very special two years in Cambridge, with their three young children, during his training at Ridley Hall, before moving to Southborough. Tim, Lucy and Georgina went to secondary schools in Tonbridge, and are now grown up, and the family has grown to include their lovely spouses, and 4 young grandchildren, all nearby in Crowborough.

At the beginning of 2023 Elizabeth retired from 15 years working at 'Good Neighbours' in Tunbridge Wells, offering support to the elderly, and she and Stephen began to think and pray about what the future might hold. They sensed a call to serve somewhere where their experience of both village ministry and working in a team with other churches could be used, which led them to pray about the post advertised at Cowden, Hartfield and Coleman's Hatch.

Stephen and Elizabeth are delighted to be moving to Cowden, and are looking forward to seeing, hearing and joining in with all that God is doing in these three communities through His church, to encouraging folk in discipleship, to making new friends, and to praying and working with others to see God's kingdom come.

They are also looking forward to the different pace of life and ministry that comes with a 'House for Duty' post, and to time for walks on the Ashdown Forest with grandchildren, more sailing, gardening and other assorted hobbies.




Hartfield Remembers
