3.	Exclusion of Press and Public It was agreed that the Press and Public be excluded from item 18 on the agenda.	
4.	Minutes RESOLVED that the minutes of the meeting held on the 10 October 2023 be confirmed as a true record and signed by the Chairman.	
5.	Matters Arising Another date is needed for a meeting with Cumbria Highways to discuss the damage to the verge at the bottom of Kingside Hill. The Council has no money to do any repairs at the moment.	
6.	Public Participation There are two potholes and a crack in the concrete at the entrance to the Lido Village, at the corner of Barracks Bridge, between the road and the gate. The old wall is where the boundary is for the Lido Village and what belongs to Cove. The issue will be reported to Cumbria Highways. The chevrons sign has also been damaged which warns motorists of the sharp bend which will also be reported to Cumbria Highways.	
7.	Financial Report The Clerk provided an up-to-date financial report which showed a balance of £26,445.09 in the Current Account and £270.11 in the Deposit Account on 9 January 2024. This includes the following funding for the cemetery building: - £10k Lottery Community Fund, £10k Hellrigg Community Fund & £1k Cumbria County Council. The Parish Council has also just received notification that it has been awarded £10k from the Robin Rigg Community Fund.	
8.	Requests for financial assistance Another request has been received from the Great North Air Ambulance. A donation of £100 has already been made in this financial year and it was agreed to leave this for the time being.	
9.	Payment of Accounts Cheque payments to 9 January 2024 were approved for payment by the Parish Council.	
10.	Budget 2024/25 The Clerk produced some draft figures based on previous year's accounts and the current year's spending. It was agreed to raise a precept of £7,500 for 2024/25 which would provide an additional £1,500 towards the Cemetery building project. This would result in a charge of approx. £55 on a band D property which is what it was before the boundary change took place.
