Understanding the Trial

Every dog starts with 100 points. The judge deducts points for faults using his own judgement. The judge sets the time allowed for the run calling the handler off when the time is up. Points scored are still registered. A handler may choose to retire at any point in the run. The judge may disqualify a dog that grips a sheep, or where the judge feels the dog is out of control.

It helps the concentration of handlers if you don't applaud until the pen gate is shut or until they leave the course.

Here are some introductory points, but do feel free to ask the handlers questions. Please do not disturb the judge.

Some of the features of a good run are described below:

Outrun 20 points

On command the dog leaves the feet of the handler and runs to the top of the course in a way that does not disturb the sheep at the top. The dog arrives behind the sheep without moving them before receiving the command to stop. A dog crossing the course during the Outrun will heavily penalized.

Lift 10 points

On command the dog lifts the sheep, keeping them together and moving at a steady pace. At this point the dog imposes his authority on the sheep.

Fetch 20 points

The dog moves the sheep in a straight line from the point at which the lift took place to the fetch gates, taking them in a straight line through the gates and then to the post in front of the shepherd. The judge is looking for a straight line and steady pace, which is difficult if the course is uneven.

Drive and Cross Drive 30 points

The dog should move the sheep in straight lines towards the two gates and then back to the post. The turns around the post and two gates should be tight.

Shed 10 points

The aim is for the handler and dog to separate two sheep from the group, and for the dog to hold the two sheep under control until told to release them. Some judges have a preference for dogs that 'shed' the sheep head on i.e. take the last two sheep in the group. In some trial a ring is marked on the ground within which the shedding must take place.

Pen 10 points


The dog should bring the sheep back together after shedding and take them directly to the mouth of the pen. Once the handler is holding the rope on the pen gate they cannot leave the gate until the sheep are penned. Points are deducted if the sheep break away around the side of the pen. The run is completed when the pen gate is closed.
