Living History at Quarry Bank Mill

Year 8 pupils recently visited Quarry Bank Mill in Styal to supplement the work that they had been doing in class on the industrial revolution.

Beginning in the textile mill, pupils had a go at typical jobs such as 'doffing the bobbins' and 'carrying the cans' before entering the weaving floor and experiencing what it was like to hear the machines in action.

In the Apprentice House, the pupils were given an insight into the lives of the pauper apprentices who once worked at the mill, how they lived and the punishments they were given. Charles was unfortunate enough to receive a typical punishment, but only for a minute!

Finally, the children visited Styal Village and the cottages that were built by the Greg family to house their adult workers. It is a fantastic resource on our doorstep and I would recommend a visit if you have not already been.
