


SENIOR SCHOOL NEWSLETTER

Alumnus - Bob Eckersall

Bob Eckersall joined Hulme Hall College as it was known then, in 1957. He left at 16 and went straight into the world of work at his father's business initially, then moving onto being an export representative for a carpet company, before ending up setting up a business in food wholesale. Bob came out of retirement in 2009 to set up Clwydian Walking Holidays Ltd and now lives in Denbigh.

What was pupil life like at Hulme Hall?

The Headmaster was the formidable Mr Rogerson. The discipline was strict and corporal punishment was used. If you stepped out of line the dreaded visit to the Headmaster's study at the end of the day was required. Sports were greatly encouraged and I was very keen on football, cricket and athletics, I was even captain of the football team. Inter-house competitions were promoted and we had end of term matches between the boys and the teachers.

What do you remember most about your time at Hulme Hall?

Assessment of my academic ability was fair and I had to work hard at subjects like French but eventually it stood me in good stead in my career so the hard work was worth it. I left school at 16 much to the disgust of Mr Rogerson who felt I had university capability. I entered into employment with my father instead. On reflection, Mr Rogerson was right, it was a mistake and I should have continued on an

academic path. Hulme Hall College gave me a good grounding for my future and enabled me to absorb the inevitable knocks along one's career path.

Mr Rogerson ruled Hulme Hall with a firm hand but it was his basic values of life and academia which I'm sure became an influence to all pupils who crossed his path.

What are you most proud of in your life so far?

I'm proud that despite all that life has thrown at me I have survived with some fantastic relationships, have a loving family and have provided my way through life.

What is your best piece of advice to a senior pupil now, that you wish you had known when you left Hulme Hall?

Remember that the early part of your life will influence your future.

Remain strong and determined whatever life throws at you.

There is always a future.
