### Government Free Early Entitlement

- The Government Grant is available for children aged 2 to 4.
- All 2 to 4-year-olds in England can get 570 free hours per year. It's usually taken as 15 hours a week for 38 weeks of the year.
- Some 3 to 4-year-olds are eligible for 30 hours free childcare a week.
- Grant hours can be taken solely and only meal charges will apply.
- Your child will be eligible the term after their third birthday.

**Any hours, between 8.00am and 4.00pm, beyond those funded by the Government Free Early Entitlement are charged at £9.00 per hour.**
