

December dawns! The Church rises to celebrate the start of a brand new year! The season of Advent is here, and the festive time of Christmas is upon us!

It all starts on Sunday, 1st December with the celebration of Advent Sunday. St Peter's Church opens its doors with bell ringing to welcome John Sentamu, the Right Reverend Archbishop of York, as he leads the congregation in our morning communion service.

Advent, a part of the Christian calendar since Pope St Gregory the Great (591-604). Advent the first season of the Church year leading up to Christmas and including the four preceding Sundays. Advent, according to the Oxford English Dictionary, the season before Nativity; the coming of an important person or event. Yes, it's the season of Advent, heralding a time of preparation, as we wait for the Nativity of Jesus at Christmas; and the return of Jesus at His Second Coming. And as we look forward to Christmas Day and all the celebrations of the day, so we prepare ourselves, week by week, Sunday by Sunday.

There is much to look forward to in Advent. The Advent wreath with its four coloured candles, lit each Sunday; and the large central white candle, lit on Christmas Day. The Advent Calendar, daily taking us closer and closer to the day of Jesus' birth. The Advent Candle, standing tall, and lit each day, till the light of Christ comes into the world. All these wonderful preparations drawing us nearer and nearer to that day of joy as God's Son is born. Will we be ready to welcome Jesus into our homes and into our hearts?

Along the way there are events to enjoy. For those who want further understanding, on 3rd December at the Methodist Chapel at 7pm, there is an **Advent Reflection on** 'Christmas - what is it really about?'. Then for those who love singing and hearing the Christmas readings, on 18th December, at St Peter's Church at 7pm. Nine Lessons and Carols. On 22nd December there are two events, firstly at St Peter's Church at 10.45am, a Christmas Big Sing; followed at 4.00pm by the Village Nativity, this time taking place in the Simpson's Stable down Sheepman Lane, a must for all families. Again for families and especially children, 24th December sees our annual Crib **Service** at 4.00pm. Finally at 10.30am at the Methodist Chapel we celebrate **Christmas Day** with a Family Christmas Service. Everyone is welcome, do come and join us.







Hutton Cranswick Parish Council

Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council held in the W.I. Hall, Main Street, Cranswick on Wednesday, 23rd October, 2019 at 7.00 pm.

Present: Councillors: Alderton, Kelly, Lock, Poolford, Richardson (in the Chair), Sibley-Calder, Mrs Simpson, Swan,

Teare, Thompson, Wilson. Ward Councillor: Lisseter.

PC Martin Phillips and PCSO Chris Webster (attended for agenda item 6, minute 19/227).

Parishioners present: One. The Clerk recorded the minutes.

19/223 Apologies: Councillors: Mills and Wilkinson. Ward Councillors: Evison and Owen.

19/224 Declaration of Pecuniary and Non-Pecuniary interests

Cllr Mrs Simpson Item No.15 - 19/236 - Non-pecuniary - HCSRA Committee Member. Cllr Teare Item No.15 - 19/236 - Non-pecuniary - HCSRA Committee Member.

19/225 Minutes – **Resolved** – That the Minutes of the Meeting of the Council held on the 25th September, 2019, be approved and signed as a correct record (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Thompson).

19/226 Matters arising – Further to minute 19/200, it was noted, there was to be no changes to the usual arrangements for the Remembrance Service.

19/227 Police Report – PC Martin Phillips gave an overview of Humberside Police current policing numbers and recruitment strategy and the operational priorities of the Driffield Neighbourhood Policing Team. Consideration was being given for the current Fire Station site in Driffield to become a joint station for Police, the Ambulance Service and the Fire Brigade Service.

Crime in the Driffield Area had remained static over the last year. The Team was focussing on the dangers of speeding vehicles and recent lead thefts. The introduction of the use of CCTV had proved a successful crime prevention measure. The Community Alert initiative had also proved a success, where the public can make the Police aware of incidents and vice versa. It was suggested Parish Councils consider the use of CCTV.

PCSO Sharp had reported Main Street, Cranswick was not a suitable location for a speed survey, however, next week a test was to be carried out on Station Road.

Updates for East Wolds and Coastal and Driffield/Rural for September, 2019 were noted.

19/228 Public Participation: Paul Lisseter referred to the earlier discussion on speeding surveys and agreed to see if he still had some old planning information that included some speed data for Station Road.

19/229 Planning Matters – The following decisions were noted:

- (a) **19/02570/PLF**: Erection of a single storey extension to side and rear with render finish, following demolition of existing utility area, installation of replacement windows, removal of existing chimney stack on east elevation and erection of a detached garage at The Firs, 20 Orchard Lane, Hutton, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PZ Full Planning Permission Approved 4 Conditions.
- (b) **19/02492/PLF**: Erection of a single storey extension to rear, following removal of existing, internal and external alterations, including the construction of two dormers to the front, with alterations to the existing front dormer at 7 Southgate, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QT Full Planning Permission Approved 3 Conditions.
- (c) **19/02689/PLF**: Erection of single storey extension at The Nook, 18 Station Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QZ Full Planning Permission Approved 3 Conditions.

19/230 Planning Applications:

19/03241/TCA: CONSERVATION AREA - HUTTON - Fell maple tree due to overshadowing and future risk of subsidence at 11 Mill Street, Elm Cottage, 13 Mill Street, Hutton, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PU—Tree in Conservation Area — **Resolved** — Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Poolford/seconded Cllr Thompson).

19/231 Representatives reports:

- (a) In Bloom Cllr Mrs Simpson reported the revamp of all containers was complete. A plant sub-group had been set up to buy in seed and plants and advise on planting. The Team had received donations of good quality top soil and manure. Further assistance at the Station was required.
 - Unfortunately, there was very little progress in completing the improvement work at the Station. The wall remained in a dangerous condition.
 - Two Members of the Team were to attend a Rail promotion Event on the 31st October, 2019. The Team was to support the Santa Special on the 14th December, 2019.
 - The Advent Trail Windows was to be repeated again in December.
 - The next Team meeting was on the 12th November, 2019.
- (b) **Pond** Cllr Sibley-Calder had purchased replacement lighting and it would be installed on the 27th October, 2019. Cllr Poolford reported that the weed was under control at present. He would continue to closely monitor for any further weed growth.
- 19/232 Play Area Cllr Thompson reported on obtaining grants to part fund the proposed improvements to the Play Area. A meeting with East Riding of Yorkshire Council, relating to a commuted sum allocation, was planned for the 29th October, 2019. The Clerk was to seek further clarification regarding inspections.
- **19/233 Community Safety** Cllr Richardson reported the footpath from South Lodge to the Trout Stream was overgrown and could prove dangerous.

A proposal from the Scouts to hold an event on The Green on the 2nd December, 2019 was noted. Further consideration would be given to the final arrangements for the event at the next Meeting.

19/234 Clerk's report:

- (a) **Speed Survey Resolved** To accept the offer from the East Riding of Yorkshire Council to look into undertaking a speed survey in the Spring of 2020.
- (b) **School Crossing Patrol Officer** East Riding of Yorkshire Council continued its efforts to recruit a School Crossing Patrol Officer. An advert would be placed in the Bulletin.
- 19/235 Allotments The Clerk would chase up payment of outstanding rents. There were two vacant plots.
- **19/236 HCSRA** Cllr Mrs Simpson reported a Volunteer Evening was to be held on 25th October, 2019.
- 19/237 Parish Plan Cllr Teare was to provide a draft report for discussion at the next Meeting.
- **19/238 Sign at the junction of Hutton Balk with A164** Cllr Mrs Simpson reported that she had cleared the site, following the damage caused to the sign. It was noted that it appeared that East Riding of Yorkshire Council had commenced work to provide a replacement sign.
- **19/239 Footpath across The Green from the School to Hotham Road** Cllr Swan had received concerns over the condition of the footpath. The Clerk would report the poor condition of the footpath to Highways.
- 19/240 Survey on Allowances Resolved To inform East Riding of Yorkshire Council that Hutton Cranswick Parish Council did not wish to pay an allowance to the Chairman or its Members (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Richardson).
- 19/241 Creation of an area for dogs at the School A request received from a resident was withdrawn.
- **19/242 Consultation from BT on the proposed removal public payphones Resolved** To purchase the BT public phone on Main Street, Cranswick for £1 (proposed Cllr Kelly/seconded Cllr Alderton).

Floods happen quickly and often without warning.

There is nothing you can do to prevent a flood, and scientists warn that an effect of climate change will be more frequent flash flooding in the future.

Flooding facts

- Just 150mm (six inches) of fast-flowing water can knock an adult off their feet
- Electric current can pass along downed power lines in floodwaters
- A car can float in just 600mm (two feet) of water
- Flash floods can cause walls of water 10 to 20 feet high
- Around five million people in the UK live in areas at risk of flooding.

Important flood safety advice

Remember flood water will probably contain sewage, which can cause disease. Always wash your hands/arms/ legs after coming into contact with floodwater with hot water and soap.

Keep contaminated footwear and clothing away from children. Do not allow children to play in floodwater.

As well as the risk of disease, grates and covers may have dislodged under the pressure of floodwater which can create a drowning risk.

If you need to walk through floodwater consider using a pole (brush handle) to test the ground in front of you.

Driving on flooded roads

Stay in first gear and **drive slowly** as the wash from your car could flood properties and oncoming vehicles.

Slip the clutch to keep the engine speed higher than normal avoiding a stall.

Where possible drive towards the middle of the road to avoid the deeper water.

Safe & Sound Fund:

A pot of money is available to residents across the East Riding to help them minimise the fear of crime by increasing their home security.

The safe and sound scheme, run by East Riding of Yorkshire Council, allows people who may be vulnerable, to apply for additional home security measures such as additional locks for doors and windows, door chains and window alarms.

To qualify, applicants must be aged 60 or over or disabled and be a home owner, private sector tenant or housing association tenant and the combined savings of everyone living in the household must not exceed £23,250.

The scheme is not available to anyone who is council house tenant. Successful applicants will be entitled to a free home security assessment and the fitting of any security measures.








A Trip to Murton Park
