Hope you are getting out all your winter woollies as the temperature is starting to drop. Now me, not wearing anything but spikes, just put an extra layer of fat on to keep me warm but more importantly to help feed my body through the cold times when I hibernate.

You know nature is wonderful because just as I need to eat more the nights are longer to give me more time to do more eating, Yum Yum. I really do appreciate all of you lovely people who are putting food and water out for me, don't worry if it isn't eaten every night as there are still a lot of beetles and grubs about. If you want some hints on what I like to eat you can't go wrong with some cat biscuits just somewhere dry and where the pesky cats can't get to it first. I also love a bit of dog Pate, or tins of cat or dog food, just not in gravy or fish ones. Bread, milk and mealworms are vey bad for me but I love eating them, easier if you just keep temptation away from me.

When the temperature is below 5 degrees for four or five nights I will be tucked up in my nest, if we have a warm spell for a few nights I do come out to look for food so would love it if a few of you would keep the biscuits out, the beetles and worms are never as easy to find. LIVING WITH UNCERTAINTY

Wouldn't it be great if we could predict what the weather was going to do from day to day? Paul Hudson on Look North does his best, but there are so many factors to consider, and at its best any kind of forecasting is therefore an inexact science.

The most unpredictable factor in any situation, in my experience, is the "H Factor" – the Human Factor. People can be wonderfully kind, generous, helpful and courageous; but, equally, they can be unkind, stingy, unhelpful and cowardly. It sometimes seems as if it depends which side they (or – let's be honest - we!) get out of bed on a particular morning.

On Remembrance Sunday, 10 November, and Armistice Day, 11 November, many of us across the UK and beyond will be remembering those who have laid down their lives for others in war, whether long ago or much more recently. In times of war, we see both "the best of the best" and "the worst of the worst"...

For Christians, any talk of sacrifice takes us to the symbol of the cross, which - if you think about it - is at the heart of our national flag. The cross reminds us of a man called Jesus, who - the Bible tells us - laid down his life for us. Not just for "the best of the best", but, equally, for "the worst of the worst" ... not to mention all those (most of us) who live, most of the time, somewhere in between those two extremes...

Introducing our new Superintendent Minister : Rev'd Richard Teal . . .

Hello, and thank you for your very kind invitation to contribute to your village newsletter.

I arrived as the new Superintendent Minister of the Driffield-Hornsea Circuit at the beginning of September and both Sue and I have been made to feel very welcome. A little information about myself which is what has been requested.

I was born into a tenant farming family in the Yorkshire Dales with no church connections. My childhood ambition was to be a music teacher and then one day the minister from the village's Methodist Church asked if I would play the piano at worship for them. Usually I would take a book to read during the sermon, but one day I forgot and listened and as Wesley said, 'my heart was strangely warmed'. From that moment I was converted to Christ.

When I was 16, I was working in the fields when I heard a voice say three times, 'Richard I want you for the ministry'. I knew that to be the voice of God, so rather than music, that is the path I followed. My minister advised I 'taste life' before moving into ministry so I took a job in sales and production. In 1978 I went to train at Wesley College, Bristol. At the end of my third year I was pulled out early due to the shortage of ministers. Newly married to Susan, we moved to

Gateshead. By the age of 28 I was Superintendent Minister of the Berwick upon Tweed Circuit and then moved to Beverley.

I became Chair of the Cumbria Methodist District in 2008. As Chair of District I have represented Methodism on three national ecumenical committees as well as serving on the Methodist Medical Committee and as a Director of the Methodist Housing Society. I have recently completed my term as co-chair of the national Methodist/URC Rural strategy group. It has been a huge honour and privilege to have served as a Chair of District but no more so than being a Circuit minister. I have always said I would return for my last appointment to Circuit ministry never thinking it would be in Driffield near to where my two sons live who are both involved in the Agricultural Industry.

What are my par!cular interests in ministry?

1: I am passionate about ecumenical relationships. During my time in Cumbria we created the 1st ecumenical county.

2: Pastoral Care: I am a great believer in the Pastoral Care of people both in the church and community.

3: Rural Churches: I am concerned that rural churches grow and develop and committed to a Christan presence in every village.

4: Mission: I am committed to each church having a Mission Acton Plan with direct mission focus.

5: Relevant Worship: Worship is our primary reason for being. It must be of the best quality that we can offer.

Thank you once again for this opportunity and I look forward to getting to know you.

- (a) In Bloom The In Bloom Team achieved the Gold standard in the Large Village category, the Playgroup gained Gold for the first time, and the School, James the Butcher, Hutton Cranswick Fisheries and Paul Harrison Cars gained Silver Gilt Awards. The judges had high praise for the efforts of the community at Hutton Cranswick. It was noted Southlands and The Farm Shop will enter the competition next year.

A range of new equipment from an experienced supplier, with emphasis on product safety and design, using quality materials and providing a dedicated aftersales care service, was proposed. It was **Resolved** – That Cllr Thompson explores match funding options and obtains a fixed price for the proposal (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Thompson). A quotation for £220.00 for fence repairs was approved (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Teare).

An incident of dog fouling on the Play Area had been reported, the Council noted that dogs were not allowed on the play area with a general reminder to all dog owners to pick up after their dogs, recognising that most dog owners are responsible and do so.

Milly told us about rationing during the war. She reported that one adult would only get 2oz of butter, 4oz of margarine, 2oz of



cheese, 4oz of lard, 1 egg or one dried egg, 4oz of ham, 8oz of sugar, 3pints of milk and 2oz of tea. That amount of food needed to last for a week and was not a lot to feed a whole family. Since rationing was a long time ago she might have missed a couple of foods that were also rationed. Even though the war ended rations still went on for a few more years until food supplies were increased.

<u>Air Raids</u>

Milly lived in a tri-house of 16 so she didn't have a back garden. This meant they didn't have an air raid shelter of there own. Luckily the city had some shelters built. Milly lived in Hull so she was bombed regularly so she spent most nights in an air raid shelter. Once Milly was in the street and suddenly she noticed a doodlebug lying on the floor so she ran as fast as she could and screamed for help!

Celebrations at the end of the war

We asked Milly how she felt at the end of the war and she replied by saying she felt joyful. The road that she lived on held a street party as a celebration. Milly wasn't allowed out into the street for the party but she watched from a window.
