Where would we be without friends?

September can be a month of change for so many with the start of Education or the continuation of it but at a different institution. This can be so stressful or 'a walk in the park'.

What makes the difference? Friends!

Friends keep us company; they help and support us; they tell us things that no one else does; perhaps the most important, they care about us and so are there for us.

Jesus knew the importance of friends. He had 12 special friends who travelled with him, as well as lots of others. Those 12 weren't chosen because of their social standing; in fact at least 2 could be described as undesirables (Matthew who worked as a tax collector for the hated Romans and Simon the Zealot, or terrorist as far as the Romans were concerned) and 4 were fishermen.

Jesus understood the meaning of 'friendship'. He didn't ditch his friends when he didn't like what they said. James and John were not expelled from his circle of special friends because they wanted to call down thunder on the inhabitants of a village. He didn't turn on Judas for betraying him or on Peter for denying him.

Jesus gives us a pattern for friendship, a pattern which we've seen in the Old Testament and in other parts of the new Testament.

David and Jonathan were the best of friends; when his father planned to kill David, Jonathan warned him. And saved his life.

Paul had friends who helped him in his missionary work. He could not have achieved what he did without them.

Friends are important.

Today they may be at the end of a telephone to text or speak with, on Facebook, on Skype or other modes of communication, for when we cannot meet them. We can never have too many friends but we can have too few.

Some have no friends and that can lead to loneliness and a feeling of isolation, of being cut off from all around you. We are all God's friends, even though some are unaware of this. We need to emulate the friendship and love that Jesus showed to all irrespective of their station in life or faith.

Did you hear of the Yorkshire man who visited a stonemason to organise a memorial for his recently deceased wife. His wife was a good Christian woman who served God all her life and thought that the words **"She was Thine"** would be a fitting tribute. Later he went back for the unveiling and to his horror it read **'She was Thin'.** The husband said you have missed the **'E'** off. On his next visit he was even more annoyed when he saw that the stonemason had carved **'E' she was thin**!

The family of a wealthy American family commissioned a biographer to write the story of their rich and powerful Father. As the work progressed they suddenly remembered that they had forgotten to warn the writer of 'Uncle George' who, for selling state secrets to the Russians, was executed in the electric chair. The biographer assured them that he could handle the situation. When the book was published it read 'George occupied a chair of applied electronics at an important government institution. He was attached to his position by the strongest ties and his death came as a real shock.'!

In April 1999 someone had reported that the folk musician Dave Swarbrick had died after a short stay in a Coventry hospital. The Daily telegraph printed an obituary. But he hadn't died at all. Thankfully it was a favourable account of his life. It is not something everyone gets to do, and with a smile he said "As a musician it's not the first time I have died in Coventry".

Most people are familiar with the name Alfred Nobel, after whom the Nobel Prizes are named. Nobel made his fortune as the result of an invention of his dynamite. One morning, he opened his newspaper and was astonished to read his own obituary in the paper. He was feeling sad as it was because his brother had died, but a careless reporter had published the obituary of the wrong Nobel. It described him as "the dynamite king, the industrialist who became rich from explosives." It made Alfred Nobel sound like nothing more than a merchant of death. Nobel was very upset by what he saw ... not simply that the wrong person was being remembered, but the awful picture it painted. Alfred Nobel resolved that day to change the course of his life and do something positive for society. He left his entire fortune to be awarded to individuals who have done the most to benefit humanity, and the result was five Nobel Prizes that are awarded with such fanfare each year.

What if you could read your own obituary? What will be said about you? What memory or image would you like people to remember you by? What impression will you leave?

19/163 Minutes – Resolved – That the Minutes of the Meeting of the Council held on the 26th June, 2019, be approved and signed as a correct record (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Sibley-Calder).

19/164 Police Report – Updates for East Wolds and Coastal and Driffield/Rural for June, 2019 were noted. The Council was keen to improve road safety in the Village, in particular to reduce speeding traffic. PCSO Webster reported surveillance was in place on the 30 mile an hour speed limit zone on the A164 on Beverley Road through Cranswick. In the last few weeks 38 cases of speeding had been recorded. A speed board was to be located in the Village to monitor the speed of traffic along Main Street and Station Road. The Council was to be provided with details of Community Speed Watch initiative.

The Clerk was to contact East Riding of Yorkshire Council's Road Safety for advice in arranging a speed survey.

19/165 Public Participation:

- (a) Paul Lisseter outlined his concerns regarding planning application 19/01988/PLF (agenda item 9(a) minute 19/167(a), which the Council noted.
- (b) Melvyn Teare referred to agenda item 30(d) (minute 19/182(d) notes from Parish Council Liaison Meetings. A map showing Land Bids for Hutton Cranswick received by East Riding of Yorkshire Council's call for sites to be undertaken, as part of the East Riding Local Plan Review Options Consultation, was noted. There were over 20 sites identified for housing development in Hutton Cranswick. The Parish Council would be consulted on the options at a later stage of the consultation.

19/166 Planning Matters – The following decisions were noted:

- (a) 19/01410/PLF: Erection of a general-purpose agricultural building to provide cover for existing concrete area, following demolition of portal building and construction of roof to existing washdown area at Manor Farm, Burn Butts Lane, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9JS – Full Planning Permission - Approved – 3 Conditions.
- (b) 19/01389/PLF: Erection of an agricultural building to provide a covered area at Manor Farm, Burn Butts Lane, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9JS – Full Planning Permission - Approved – 3 Conditions.
- (c) 19/01514/PLF: Erection of a two-storey extension to rear, following demolition of existing garage at 25 Laburnum Avenue, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QH – Full Planning Permission -Approved – 3 Conditions.
- (d) 19/01718/PLF: Application of insulated render to front, side and rear elevations at 12 Main Street, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QR – Full Planning Permission - Approved – 3 Conditions

- (a) 19/01988/PLF: Erection of 5 detached dwellings with associated garages and erection of a detached garage to 4 The Green, following demolition of existing garage and outbuildings and part demolition of existing dwelling, South Holme, 4 The Green, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QU Full Planning Permission Resolved To object to the application, as the proposal was in conflict with planning policies in the East Riding Local Plan Strategy Document and the Allocation Document (proposed Cllr Teare/seconded Cllr Mills).
- (b) 19/02228/PLF: Conversion of existing garage to additional living accommodation, 40 Hutton Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PH – Full Planning Permission – Resolved – Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Mills/seconded Cllr Wilson).
- (c) 19/02229/PLF: Alterations and extension to existing detached garage/workshop to form a self-contained annexe, Land and Building, North of The Willows, 3 Station Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QZ – Full Planning Permission – Resolved – Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Poolford/seconded Cllr Mills).
- (d) Planning Applications that had a deadline for comments before the next Parish Council Meeting planned for the 25th September, 2019 – Resolved – That applications be considered via e-mail (proposed Cllr Poolford/seconded Cllr Mills).

19/168 Representatives, reports:

(a) In Bloom – The In Bloom Team had received written congratulations from RHS Yorkshire In Bloom Judges on this year's entry. The Judges recognised the high standards, dedication, enthusiasm and support by the community in Hutton Cranswick. Four members of the Team had signed up for the Award Ceremony at York Race Course on the 10th September, 2019. The Team had a stall at the Village Show to assist with costs in attending the Ceremony.

Cllr Mrs Simpson requested a letter of thanks be sent to ERVAS for all the support given by The Volunteen Green Group of youngsters from Kings Mill Special School.

A request for donations of planters and containers had proved very successful.

A resident had suggested a planter be located close to the Armistice Memorial Seat on The Green. Cllr Mrs Simpson had raised concerns, on behalf of a number of residents, with Northern Rail, on the time taken and lack of progress in completing the improvements at the Station.

(b) **Pond** – It was agreed to purchase an ornamental cow for the Christmas nativity scene. The new growth of weed was to be removed from the pond.

19/169 Play Area – The wilful damage caused to the safety surface beneath the aerospeed play equipment had been repaired at a cost of £1450.00. A claim to recover the costs was being considered by the Council's Insurer. The Council is gathering information to try and identify the culprit that caused the damage and will inform the Police of any findings.

Concerns over the safety of the see saw had been reported to the installer.

Cllr Teare had made good some damage to the basket swing.

Cllr Thompson was undertaking a review of the equipment in the play area and exploring potential grant funding.

19/170 Clerk's report:

- (a) **Memorial seating removed from the Green Resolved** To locate the seat under tree T26 or T27 on The Green, Cllr Poolford to confirm the most appropriate location (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Wilson).
- (b) **Insurance Policy** Noted the amendment to include the picnic table on the schedule of Street Furniture.
- (c) **Damaged sign on the A164** Noted the East Riding of Yorkshire Council's engineers plan to repair the sign in the next couple of weeks. Cllr Evison was to request the highways engineers to reduce the cutting of the verges, in proximity to the sign, to a more appropriate area.
- (d) Reply from East Riding of Yorkshire Council to Hutton Cranswick Bowls Club regarding improving safety at the exit, on the side of the White Horse Inn – Noted the East Riding of Yorkshire Council's policy required that proposals for the introduction of waiting restrictions was not normally considered in rural villages or urban residential areas, unless justified by a poor accident record or obstruction to bus services. These conditions had not been met, as there was no record of any accidents occurring at the location. The Highway Code states that parking was not permitted within 10 metres of a junction. This was a matter for the Police to monitor and enforce.

19/171 Allotments – The Tenancy Agreement was reviewed and accepted. The Rent was to remain at £15.00 (proposed Cllr Poolford/seconded Cllr Mills). A new water meter was to be installed on the 2nd August, 2019.



Community Speed Watch

The Parish Council has received information on this scheme. It is a community led scheme to monitor vehicle speeds in an area.

The volunteers who take part are all trained by an approved Police trainer in the use of a speed detection device. The volunteers will record the registration numbers of vehicles travelling in excess of the speed limit. Once they report their findings to the Community Speed Watch Coordinator at Humberside Police, a series of warning letters are issued to the registered keeper of that vehicle, culminating in a letter being hand delivered by a Police officer and the possibility of the offending vehicles details being added to a database for future enforcement by the Police.



Scheme to replace the sewer pipe

Here is information about the scheme to replace the sewer pipe from Hutton Cranswick Sewage Pumping Station (SPS) which is located at the end of Southgate, to the Wastewater Treatment Works (WwTW) in Watton. The existing pipe is ageing and in need of replacement. When it bursts there's a risk of pollution and sewer flooding, so Yorkshire Water need to carry out this work to significantly reduce the risk of that happening again in the future.

They are hoping to start this scheme week commencing 16 September and will take until the end of March 2020 to complete. The normal working hours will be 8am to 6pm Monday to Friday. On occasions they may need to work a little later and at the weekend. No work will be completed over the Christmas and New Year holidays: Saturday 21 December to Sunday 5 January.

They will need to build a compound area to store materials and welfare units for the scheme and this will be located at Little Lane, Watton which leads towards Watton Abbey Farm.

Access for construction traffic for the works to the SPS and the pipeline from it will be via a track near to Hurrells Seeds off the A164 Beverley Road and not via Southgate.

The new pipeline will be laid by excavating along the route of the existing pipe and also using directional drilling techniques which will avoid excavating in localised areas such as water courses and under the A164 Beverley Road. The existing pipe will continue to be used until the new pipe is laid and flows switched over at the SPS. At the time of the changeover they will tanker from the SPS in order to maintain customers wastewater services. This will be pre-planned and they will notify the parish council and customers in advance. The tankering should be completed through the day time. They will restore all working areas in the highway, fields and verges once they have completed the scheme.

Due to the nature of the work, and to ensure the safety of footpath users, they will have to close some footpaths which cross our working areas during the scheme. Footpath closure notices detailing alternative routes will be signed at the point of closure. If you have any questions you can call their Customer Service Team on 0344 848 1099 (Monday to Thursday 8am to 5.30pm and 8am to 5pm on Friday).


