

## Hutton Cranswick Village in Bloom

This article forms part of the end-of-year report given to the Parish Council by Hutton Cranswick in Bloom. It also outlines the recent planting which has taken place over the last few months as the 'In Bloom' group moves towards a more sustainable system of planting using more perennial and fewer annual plants.

## Yorkshire in Bloom competition

We were notified early in 2020 by the RHS Yorkshire in Bloom (YIB) that due to the coronavirus situation no competitions would be held this year. We had, in fact, decided not to participate this year as we needed to have a year out to completely re-vamp all containers and planted areas.

## Coffee Morning cancellation

The last meeting of the 'In Bloom' group took place on 10<sup>th</sup> March, just prior to lockdown. This was a planning meeting for the major Coffee Morning/Fundraiser scheduled to take place at SRA on 28<sup>th</sup> March. Raffle prizes had been donated, stall holders recruited, etc., and many plants donated. Due to the pandemic, this could not go ahead, but the plants will be used within the village or be displayed for sale when restrictions ease further.

## Community Input

Whilst unable to do any group planting or maintenance, individuals have – with care – maintained their respective areas, and as the current position eases, the group should be able to continue with planned works.

## Containers/change of planting areas

In early Spring the old wooden barrels from the junction of Mill Street and Church Lane were removed and more recently a permanent ground bed established in that area. This will be easier to maintain and is more appropriate to this area.

Four galvanised farm troughs donated at the end of 2019 have been sited on the grass verge of Hutton Road. They have been planted up sustainably and are doing well.

The two-tier wooden planters originally sited on the verge of the junction of Main Street and the A164 were moved and re-sited on either side of the Cranswick map and planted up.



A donated galvanised farm trough (originally on wheels) has been sited next to one of the seats along the Green path from Main Street to Southgate: this is filled with soil but has yet to be planted. It will be painted in the fullness of time.

Currently the troughs normally sited outside SPAR have been removed in order that lines for "social distancing" can be used by customers. These will be replaced in time.

Four wooden troughs at the top of Main Street have been emptied and will be planted up soon, in addition to the two adjacent wheelbarrows.

A container has been set aside for location/planting up next to the Memorial seat on the Green/pondside.

There are plans to install planters donated at the end of 2019 as "carriages" for the replica train at the Station, but this would need group input and at present we are observing the advice from Northern Railway and only carrying out work at the Station which falls within the guidelines.

Two areas at the end of Station Road/Meggison's Turnpike have been re-vamped; dilapidated wooden planters removed from under the Hutton Cranswick road sign and a permanently planted bed established. The "Way of the Roses" bed underneath the fingerpost has also been updated and re-planted.

## Future Meetings

These have had to be put on hold for the immediate future, but members are continuing to keep in touch with each other and maintain planted areas where at all possible.

We cannot be sure of what the future holds – you will be reading this at least a couple of weeks after I have written it, and the restrictions we face may well have changed by then. All that we can do is to play our part, to appreciate what we do have, and to help our neighbour, and those who are in need in whatever way we can. Stay safe.





## Decoy Airfield nearby?

During the Second World War a secret department was formed at Britain's Air Ministry to co-ordinate a strategy to defeat German bombing by deception. With the help of leading technicians from the film industry, a broad range of day and night decoy sites to mislead enemy bombers were built throughout the island. This campaign of illusion was masterminded by an engineer and retired Air Ministry officer, Colonel John Fisher Turner, and did more to protect Britain's forces and civilians from the Nazi threat than, at the time, they were allowed to know. Colonel Turner formed a team

with the best film studio tradesmen, carpenters, and engineers – all for the construction of an elaborate network of dummy airfields and hundreds of decoy sites. It is believed that there were around 230 dummy airfields in the UK, although very little now survives of any of these decoys, most having been cleared after the war. Captain Tom Moore at the age of 100 completed a sponsored walk and raised over 30 million pounds for NHS Charities. He has received a Gold Blue Peter Badge, promotion to a Colonel and awarded a knighthood by HM The Queen.

On May 8th we commemorated VE day. As a family we were thinking of my Father in Law, Frank Blakey who was proud to serve in the 8th Army and fought in the Battles of El Alamein and Monet Cassino in Italy. As a nation we gave thanks for those who served.

Two Little lads walked into the dentist's office. One of them said bravely. "I want a tooth taken out and I don't want any gas, and I don't want it deadened because we're in a hurry!"

The dentist said, "You are a very brave young man, a proper little hero. Which tooth is it?"

The boy turned and pointed to his smaller friend and said, "Show him your tooth, Tommy."

Heroes aren't necessarily famous or on the front page of the newspaper. They are within our families and communities. I am sure that during this current crisis we are all thankful for those in our villages who use their time and talents to make the world a better place and don't expect any thanks or credit . When you look back on your life who are your heroes?

I have just heard recently of the death of Rev Dr John B Taylor who was one of my heroes. He was an inspiring minister and teacher and was instrumental in my training as a minister. He comforted and challenged me, pushing me to fulfil my potential way beyond my expectations. He was highly educated but very down to earth. I am the minister I am, because of him.

The day before he died, he wrote the following prayers:

Gracious God and Father of us all, whose will is that not one of his precious

children should perish, help us to know that we are loved and to rejoice in the many blessings which you have prepared for us. Thank you for what we can learn even in difficult circumstances.

We thank you, Lord, that we have discovered what it feels like to be lonely and cut off. Thank you that we have gained insight into what solitary confinement in our prisons feels like and how our housebound auntie copes when we never visit her.

Forgive us that in the midst of plenty we hoard food and act as if tomorrow depends on it. Help us to recognise that there is sufficient for all, that in the midst of grain mountains and wine lakes we still sit in a land of plenty and that such emergency reserves are there for use today. Help us, Lord, to make the needs of the poorest our priority.

We live in warm and comfortable homes, safe and secure. We pray for those who live in cardboard boxes. Help us to remember them and to unlock the means for them to return to significant relationships.

We pray, gracious, living God, when we are lost and disorientated that we may each find you walking at our side, our Companion and our Guide.

We pray through our Intercessor who sits at your right hand, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

**Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council, held on the 22<sup>nd</sup> April, 2020.**

**The Meeting was held remotely via Skype and open to the public. The session commenced at 7.00 pm.**

The Clerk recorded the minutes.

**20/093 Apologies:** Councillors: Holtby, Lock, Poolford. Ward Councillors Evison, Lisseter, Owen.

**20/094 Declaration of Pecuniary and Non-Pecuniary interests**

Cllr Kelly           Item No. 9(b) - 20(/100(b)- Pecuniary - owner of property/wife of Applicant.

**20/095 Minutes – Resolved** – That the Minutes of the Meeting of the Council held on the 25<sup>th</sup> March, 2020 be approved and signed as a correct record (proposed Cllr Thompson/seconded Cllr Alderton).

**20/096 The Local Authorities and Police and Crime Panels (Coronavirus) (Flexibility of Local Authority and Police and Crime Panel Meetings) (England and Wales) Regulations, 2020** – Advice on the Regulations from East Riding of Yorkshire Council, ENLCCA and NALC were noted. The Regulations modify some of the statutory requirements contained in the Local Government Act 1972 and the Public Bodies (Admission to Meetings) Act 1960, which govern parish councils.

The Regulations made provision for the conduct of local authority meetings held before 7<sup>th</sup> May, 2021, and for public and press access to those meetings. In summary, The Regulations permit parish councils to; hold and attend meetings remotely; alter the frequency and occurrence of meetings, including the choice of holding the annual meeting; determine the public notice for meetings; and determine how voting is carried out.

**20/097 Covid-19 Community Support Group** – On behalf of the Group, Cllr Teare reported that during the last 28 days, a volunteer good neighbourhood scheme had been established. The village was divided into 9 pods, each had a lead contact. A leaflet with a local contact telephone number was produced for each pod and delivered into every household. The leaflet described the support on offer and how to get in touch. This was followed up in The Bulletin, which went into more detail on keeping safe and the support network in place.

At the same time as the leaflet distribution, a call was put out to local people to volunteer in each of the pods. A group of 50 volunteers had been established who were able to do shopping, collect prescriptions and make friendly phone calls. The Group had assisted over 80 households on a regular basis. It had been found that by keeping it local, people know each other – and the reaction could be quick.

There were other informal groups within the churches and particular streets.

The process had settled down and was working well.

The Group Covid-19 Community Support - Hutton Cranswick had registered with [www.beecan.org](http://www.beecan.org) in the Wolds area. The nearest Community Hub was the Rugby Club at Driffield. The contact telephone number for this service was 01482 393919. A post card had been delivered to the parish council for onward delivery to vulnerable people in the community. This information was also available on the new website's front page.

The Council congratulated the Group on the effort and achievements made in such a short period of time.

Cllr Kelly left the Skype session and took no part in the consideration of the application.

**20/101 Village Show** – It was hoped that by 26<sup>th</sup> July, circumstances would allow a small-scale show at the SRA, if not a virtual show would be arranged. The schedule was to be smaller. There would be prizes for the winners with a lot of the classes being more general, to give more opportunity to choose what to create. All classes would be free and no entry form. More information would be published on the website. There would be no request for any sponsorship this year, in light of these difficult times for everyone. The Council supported the proposed arrangements for the Show (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Swan).

**20/102 Play Area** – To help keep everyone safe and reduce the risk in contracting the Coronavirus the play area was closed.

**20/103 Community Safety** – It was agreed that the temporary barrier protecting the Green, on Hobman Lane, could be removed (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Teare).

#### **20/104 Clerk's report:**

- (a) **To note** an update from Yorkshire Water Services, on the problem of ground water infiltration in to the sewer network, which could overload the pumping station located in Sheepman Lane. At present, the pumps were running well, but tankering was required to mitigate the water infiltration. The work was to prevent sewer flooding. The investigation into the matter was on hold due to COVID-19 restrictions.
- (b) **To note** receipt of the P60 End of Year Certificate for 2019-20.
- (c) **To note** the Section 137 Expenditure Limit for 2020-21 was £15,350.40.
- (d) **To note** The Accounts and Audit (Coronavirus) (Amendment) Regulations 2020 and the guidance relating to Notice of Public Rights.

**20/105 Centenary Wood** - To note the completion of the footpath work, approved at minute 20/75(b)(a).

**20/106 Communication** – Cllr Swan reported that the new website had gone live and had received positive feedback on the site. It was **Resolved** to accept an additional one-off charge of £70.00 and an increase in annual charges of £20.00 (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Thompson).

**20/107 Internal audit report for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2020 – Resolved** (a) to receive the report (b) note the auditor considered the accounts continue to be well maintained and no matters arose that needed to be drawn to the attention of the Council and (c) appoint Alan Johnson as the internal auditor for 2020-21 (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Thompson).

**20/108 Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR) for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2020 –** Following a review of the effectiveness of the system of internal control, it was **Resolved** to approve Section 1 - Annual Governance Statement 2019-20 (proposed Cllr Thompson/seconded Cllr Wilson).


