



Hello again, friends,

I finished last month by saying that I was looking forward to the end of 'lockdown'. By the time this is published, we will know whether all, or most restrictions have been lifted. I also stated that I hoped we would continue talking with those we met in the street. Never under-estimate the power of talking; it can be uplifting, encouraging, but it can be damaging, aimed at hurting someone.

Since the last Bulletin, we've probably been talking and meeting with more and more people as some restrictions have been lifted. When this Bulletin is delivered, our children will be looking forward to the end of the School Year. For some it will mean big changes such as a new school. Our young adults may be

continuing in education but somewhere different, or beginning work-related training. A new career may be looming and possibly a change in direction. We may need guidance from the people around us: parents, friends, teachers, employers.

We may be looking forward to a holiday, with family or friends. Exciting times, but also a little frightening?

I also said that Jesus was a people person. He chose 12 disciples to travel with him and they were together for about 3 years. They will have become friends. They travelled with him throughout Israel. As there were no cars, buses, trains or aeroplanes, their travel will have been on foot, except when crossing the Sea of Galilee. We know of one occasion when Jesus travelled on a donkey and that was when he entered Jerusalem for the last week of his life.

Jesus' conversations with his disciples and those he met on his journeys, whether he was healing or teaching, are recorded in the Four Gospels. His conversations were to help, to heal, to support, to teach, to show sympathy or empathy. He was never destructive in his words, even when betrayed by Judas!

Is it easier to be cruel than kind? To make someone cry or smile?

Words are mightier than the sword. Wars have started because of them.
As we hopefully look to a brighter future, we need to remember that being a 'people person' means caring about people and wanting what is best for them.

LOCAL PLAN REVIEW

Our village needs more homes – where would you like them to be?

Williamsfield Developments proposed CRA-11 is a continuation of Williamsfield Road which delivers 2, 3 and 4 bed, high quality energy efficient, including affordable, homes the village needs.

The site is well located within easy walking distance to village facilities and does not affect the conservation area or local businesses. The site location mirrors Beech View in depth, it would not intrude into open countryside but would have a wildlife meadow at the end and improved surrounding landscaping providing natural enhancement. ERYC Highways Department have confirmed the site is "acceptable" and "not likely to have a detrimental impact on the local highway network".

ERYC have determined that Hutton Cranswick's draft housing requirement is at least 170 new houses over the plan period.

We believe this is the best location for new much needed homes in Cranswick and hope you can voice your support in the Local Plan consultation.

Hutton Cranswick Parish Council Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Council, held on the 23rd June, 2021. The meeting was held at the WI Hall, Main Street, Cranswick and commenced at 7.00 pm.

Present: Councillors: Alderton, Holtby, Kelly, Lock, Poolford, Richardson (in the Chair), Mrs Simpson, Swan, Teare, Thompson, Wilkinson. One member of the public attended. The Clerk recorded the minutes.

At the request of the Chairman, all present stood for a minute's silence, in memory of Ward Councillor Paul Lisseter.

21/154 Apologies: Councillors: Sibley-Calder, Wilson. Ward Councillors: Evison and Owen.

21/155 Declaration of Pecuniary and Non-Pecuniary Interests –

Cllr Lock Item No 07 Minute 21/159 - Non-pecuniary – Husband of the applicant.

Cllr Poolford Item No 12 Minute 21/164 - Non-pecuniary – Allotment Tenant.

Cllr Mrs Simpson Item No 07 Minute 21/159 - Non-pecuniary – HCSRA Committee Member.

21/156 Minutes – **Resolved** – That the minutes of the Annual meeting of the Council and the Ordinary meeting of the Council held on the 26th May, 2021 be approved and signed as a correct record (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Lock).

21/158 Town and Parish Council Planning Liaison Meeting – Cllr Teare had previously circulated feedback on the liaison meeting he attended on the 22nd June, 2021. The topics covered were an update on the planning service; changes and updates to planning legislation; material planning considerations, when responding to planning applications and an update on the East Riding Local Plan. Planning was to provide the clerk with the presentation slides used at the meeting. The session gave a good insight to the latest planning activity in the East Riding. **21/159 Have a Go' Event at the SRA** – **Resolved** to provide £500.00 to support the Event (proposed Cllr Thompson/seconded Cllr Teare).

21/160 Planning Matters – The following decision was noted:

(a) **21/00015/STPLFE**: Erection of 3 no. linked livestock buildings for pig breeding, a slurry store and associated infrastructure at Land South of Southlands, Hutton Road, Southburn, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9ED – Full Planning Permission - Approved 11 Conditions.

21/161 Planning Applications:

- (a) **21/01606/PLF:** Erection of a single storey extension to front at Manor Farm Shop, Beverley Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9PQ Full Planning Permission **Resolved** Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Thompson).
- (b) **21/00030/REFUSE**: Notification of appeal for 21/00326/PLF Installation of external wall insulation and render following the removal of existing render at 61 Main Street, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QN. It was agreed to not make any further representation.
- (c) **21/00697/PLF**: Erection of a single storey extension to front, following removal of conservatory, erection of single storey extension to side and rear, installation of 5 roof lights to the north elevation, conversion of existing outbuilding to provide additional living accommodation, installation of roof lights and associated works at Westfield Farm House, 31 Station Road, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QZ Full Planning Permission **Resolved** Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Wilkinson/seconded Cllr Teare).
 - **21/01712/PLF**: Erection of single storey extensions to rear, following demolition of existing conservatory, erection of single storey extension to front and installation of bay windows to front at 1 The Pastures, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9YX Full Planning Permission **Resolved** Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Kelly/seconded Cllr Swan).
- (d) **21/01791/PLF**: Erection of a two-storey extension to rear and first floor extension to front with associated alterations, construction of a vehicular access with timber boundary fencing and gate to the west, and alterations to existing wall and gate on south boundary at 53 Southgate, Hutton Cranswick, East Riding of Yorkshire, YO25 9QX Full Planning Permission **Resolved** Not to object to the application (proposed Cllr Swan/seconded Cllr Thompson).
- **21/162 Play Area** Phase 2 of the improvement works was completed. The new equipment had been well used and proved popular. However, Cllr Thompson was to have a further discussion with the contractor to resolve an issue with the location of the zip line. The insurance policy had been amended to include the new items of equipment and safety surfacing.

21/163 Gatehouse Lake Committee – Feedback from the Committee meeting held on the 17th June, 2021 was noted. The angling club had revised its bankside proposal, now focusing on continuing the work to remove the weed, in readiness for a net survey in November, and trial an idea to improve the fishing pegs.

Cllr Poolford proposed to accept a quotation (£400) for undertaking a tree survey and management report, which was seconded by Cllr Mrs Simpson and agreed.

Cllr Poolford proposed to explore the provision of footpath around the perimeter of the Lake and a solution to manage the level of water in the dipping pond, which was seconded by Cllr Teare and agreed.

21/164 Allotments – It was noted, one plot remained vacant. The vermin issue was under control. East Riding of Yorkshire Council's Pest Control had quoted £209.22 for a pest control service for the period October to March. It was **Resolved** to accept the quotation (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Thompson).

21/165 Site of the former Church Rooms – **Resolved** to register the site as part of the Green (proposed Cllr Richardson/seconded Cllr Swan).

21/166 Representatives reports

(a) In Bloom – The group held an outdoor face-to-face meeting at the SRA on 3rd June, 2021.

Recent fund-raising made over £100 from the village wide garage sale.

The entries for the YIB awards are to be by a written testimony supported by photographs. Provisionally, the group agreed the categories to enter as: Yorkshire in springtime; Kind to nature; Heart of the community (the Spar shop and The White Horse have agreed to participate and support an entry); and Local transport centre. Tree pruning at the railway station is underway.

Some cutting back of nettles was required in Centenary Wood.

It was agreed to replenish the stock of village leaflets.

(b) SRA – The SRA committee met on the 20th June, 2021. The Committee was considering quotes for Astroturf maintenance/drain clearance and security improvements by the installation of CCTV. A smart meter had recently been installed. Opportunities available under the East Riding Community Grant scheme to aid the organisation to organise future events and, in general, promote covid recovery activity was being explored.

The outcome of a grant application to the Football Foundation of up to £16,000 over a period of 6 years was awaited. Regular activities of Table Tennis (Tuesday evenings) and Senior Activities (Friday mornings) had been planned to recommence from the 21st July, 2021. Risk assessments were to be reviewed. A schedule of external maintenance work was to be undertaken.

More outdoor picnic tables/seating for 6 was needed for the Ryedale Cycle event, planned for the 4th /5th September, 2021. The senior football team had been accepted into the Humber Premier League for the forthcoming season, the juniors aim to run a 4-pitch tournament in August.

Overnight parking scheme aimed at providing safe off-road motorhome parking was been considered.

(c) Pond – Cllr Sibley-Calder had confirmed that the lights on the island were in working order.

Defibrillators in Hutton Cranswick

June saw the collapse of an international footballer in a very prominent way. He survived due to the speedy arrival of persons able to undertake CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation), and more importantly the use of a defibrillator.

The commonest cause of cardiac death in adults results from an electrical rhythm disturbance in the heart resulting in it being unable to pump properly and therefore supply the body with oxygen. If CPR is not undertaken quickly, the brain is starved of oxygen and in approximately three minutes the person dies.

CPR on its own will only prolong life, but the way to get the person back to a normal electrical rhythm, and save them, is to use a defibrillator.

The defibrillator is a device that provides an electric shock across the heart that 'reboots' the heart. Essentially stopping it and allowing it to restart in a normal rhythm. This worked spectacularly in the footballer scenario, and at the date of this article he is recovering nicely.

Several years ago, with the aid of the Hutton Cranswick Parish Council and some sponsorship, we were lucky enough to obtain two defibrillators:



The one on the White Horse pub wall (kindly hosted by the landlord), has been used several times, but unfortunately due to data protection, I do not know the outcomes.





The one on the wall of the SRA, to my knowledge has not been used, but remains

there to help with any incidents that might occur whilst

individuals are undertaking sport on the ground.

How to access to defibrillators

Both defibrillators are in lockable cases which are warmed to keep them fully active even in the coldest winter. They are locked to prevent vandalism and prevent persons removing them inappropriately.

dest ent

To access the defibrillators, all that is required is to call 999, as you would normally in an emergency.

Once the triage operator has assessed the situation, if deemed appropriate, you will be told to go to one of the

defibrillators (or send someone else) and be given a code to open the cabinet. Both work on a push button system: one mechanical, the other electric.

This method of obtaining the defibrillator has two benefits:

- An ambulance or first responder will be on the way to help you.
- A trained operator will help you use the machine.

Both machines have a similar format in that the case is opened up and you will see an array of buttons and some

pads to place on the collapsed person's chest wall.

The cases are opened up, and they will both start talking to you and explain, carefully each step that you have to do (the SRA defibrillator has to have the on/off button pressed first): The persons chest is exposed to bare skin, cleaned of any water/sweat (if necessary) and the pads are placed on the skin at the places pointed out on the diagram on the pads.

The machine will then do its



work. If it tells you a shock is needed, you just stand away from the person and press the flashing button. That is all there is to it.



YOU CANNOT KILL SOMEONE BY GIVING THEM A SHOCK IN ERROR – THE MACHINE WILL NOT ALLOW IT.

You can, however, fail to get them back by not using the machine. Children in schools are taught to use these machines and they are getting more common.

They save lives

Summary

- If you see/witness a collapse and they are obviously unconscious, call 999. They will advise you what to do but mention if you are near one of the defibrillators. They will give you a code to unlock the case.
- If you know how to undertake CPR do it. If you can, have someone else to get the defibrillator and carry on with the CPR.
- Remember CPR is a holding pattern, it does not bring someone back – defibrillators do.
- Become familiar as to where they are in the villages.

Once the Covid pandemic is more under control, we are hoping to get Yorkshire Air Ambulance to undertake a Defibrillator Familiarisation Course.




