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


IACAET encourages both arts and evidence-based research for the advancement of the field. IACAET publishes its own peer-reviewed, open-access journal: 'Creative Arts in Education and Therapy – Eastern, Western and Global Perspectives' (CAET), which is the unique English language resource for research and studies in this field. The journal is indexed and collected by research databases including DOAJ, Google Scholar, WorldCat, EBSCO, public libraries and universities throughout the world. There are over fifty leading experts on the editorial board of CAET.

- Our Webinars are live online educational presentations that foster communication between presenters and attendees. Our focus is to highlight the importance of integrating body-mind and utilizes various forms of creative/artistic expression in human development through informative and experiential means.

- Webinars are linked to the open-access journal Creative Arts in Education and Therapy (CAET) – East, West and Global Perspectives. Webinars are structured into four categories:







Global Webinars

Global webinars are conscious global conversations representing voices from the West, East, North, and South. They are philosophical, timeous, contextual conversations that speak back to the vision of IACAET. Held four times a year, they are three hours long with six to ten invited presenters and speakers. Organization responsibility lies with presenters and IACAET.

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Webinars

Webinars feature one or two approaches and or one or two lead voices that are specialists in the field. They are one and a half hours long and are held six times a year. Organization responsibility lies with presenters and IACAET

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Workshop Trainings

Workshop and Training are highly specialized offerings held four times a year. Organization responsibility lies with presenters and IACAET.

Events may encompass book launches, special announcements in the field of somatics and creative arts. Organization responsibility lies with presenters and IACAET.



Held monthly on the 1st Sunday of every month, the duration of each session varies depending on the type of webinar held. They all provide an opportunity for participants to interact with each other in breakout rooms to reduce isolation and build international connections and opportunities for equal dialogue across the globe.



ORGANISATION WISE:

The Role of IACAET Webinar Curators is to ascertain the suitability of the presenter's topic and theme in line with IACAET mission and vision. Guide presenters on the structure of the webinar and request necessary information as needed. Liaise and report back to IACAET events committee on the progress of the webinars.

PRESENTERS:

IACAET Invites prominent educators, therapists, artists, industry leaders and creative practitioners in the field of somatics and creative and expressive arts on a voluntary basis to inspire attendees and help build bridges between body-mind and the creative process.

Presenters who are interested in participating in IACAET Webinars and encouraged to submit an expression of interest to info@iacase.org detailing why they would be interested in presenting at the IACAET webinar, attach their CV and proposed learning goals for attendees.

ATTENDEES:

The events are open to the public for a minimal fee and are free to registered IACAET Members. The sessions are recorded and saved for IACAET members to access.
