This is 26-year-old Andre Bryam of St Catherine Jamaica. Andre has been visually impaired from less than a year old. This was the result of a medical procedure going drastically wrong. Despite his challenge, Andre continues to surprise his friends and people around him with his ability to be self-sufficient. Andre lives independently, he proudly talks of keeping a clean home and cooking for himself. When asked how he manages he says he loves to experiment.

In 2012 whilst listening to the radio he decided he wanted to set up his own sound system and play music so as to earn a living. Currently, he uses his cell phone to play

music for the village.

Andre also has a day job where he climbs trees another one of his experiences, he climbs a tree so that he can pick coconuts for a living, he describes using a rope to help him. If he had a laptop and better equipment he could do less climbing of trees and more playing out with his sound system. We are asking that you help us to help this talented young man who describes himself as ambitious, I tend to agree. He also plays dominoes by using touch to identify the numbers of the dominoes. We would like to support him by purchasing a laptop for the visually impaired. If you would like to be a part of making Andre's dream come true then please donate. 




According to UNICEF, over 2 million children in Uganda have become orphans in the past decade. The reasons for such high figures have been attributed to a number of dilemmas, including children born with HIV/AIDS or having an HIV/AIDS positive parent, and families facing financial difficulties. These children face multifaceted challenges in their lives including poverty, conflicts, poor health and lack of food, housing, sanitation, and education. At age 15, 18% of girls and 15% of boys are out of school. School participation is highest for girls at age 10 and for boys at age 11. The official primary school entry age in Uganda is age 6. At that age, 35% of girls and 43% of boys are out of school. Why not partner to send the young innocence to school?

Sponsored children





A tragic side effect has been a burgeoning orphan crisis. Current estimates place Zimbabwe's total orphan population at 1,000,000 of which 761,000 are believed to be a consequence of AIDS. Most of them do not go to school and some of them drop out due to variable reasons comprising; hunger, lack of school fees, school supplies, school uniform, neglect, and different forms of abuse. The orphans' psychosocial problems ranged from fear, lack of parental or guardian love, trauma, stress and frustration. The emotional and psychological problems faced by the orphans also put them at higher risk for juvenile delinquency. More than one quarter of children below the age of 18 are not living with either parent, as confirmed by the MICS 2021 figure of 26.6%. Among these children, the majority have been abandoned by their parents or orphaned.

iCare so iShare International is playing a pivotal role in resuscitating hope, rejuvenating dreams and being a very strong support systems to the orphans and vulnerable children in Zimbabwe. Educational empowerment is being unveiled to many, moreover, human rights advocacy and community development. There are still many more children whose hope and dreams are to be revived through support. One child at a time will make a huge difference, it lightens a child's smile and give the child a purpose in life and the reason to dream.
