1. Main research question::

What role do legal conceptions and legal-political conceptions play in the political process? –

a discourse network analysis using the example of the discussion about Nord Stream 2

# 2. Theoretical Background:

Advocacy Coalitions-approach (Sabatier/Jenkins-Smith 1993): key assumptions:

- Advocacy Coalitions understood as "people from a variety of positions (elected and agency
  officials, interest group leaders, researchers) who share a particular belief system—i.e. a set of
  basic values, causal assumptions, and problem perceptions—and who show a non-trivial degree
  of coordinated activity over time" (Sabatier 1988: S. 139)
- Multi-Level-Governance-approach: "multiple actors and levels of government" (Sabatier/Weible 2007)

# 3. Methodological approach:

Discourse network analysis (Janning et al. 2009, Nagel 2016):

- Actors and concepts of discourses are recorded in a database:
   Qualitative-quantitative approach: data sources: newspaper articles,
   statements on websites, procedural/court documents
- Allows representations of concept networks and actor networks and their relationship to concepts
- Makes it possible to test quantitative hypotheses about network structures

#### 4. Innovative strength of the research approach

- Academic relevance of the study Interdisciplinary approach
- Practical relevance of the study:
   Understanding the relevance and importance of legal/legal-political argumentation within fragmented approaches towards energy transformation
- => Requirement for the development of legal as well as political governance integration strategies
- => regional energy cooperation as a condition "sine qua non for the energy transition in the region" (Karimi / Rodi 2021: 463)
