## Council Meeting 8th March 2008

Ten representatives from eight Branches together with the four officers attended the Council meeting in March. We had two visitors including one from Demark undertaking research into British Beekeepers! There was discussion on the items to be included in the new British Beekeepers' Association leaflet on giving advice about the types of bee likely to be found in public places and gardens and how to deal with them. This leaflet is aimed at non beekeepers for distribution at publicity events. Advice for beekeepers on the limits covered by the third party insurance cover was also suggested.

Brian Palmer presented an excellent report on the BBKA ADM, sadly advising that the capitation fee was rising from £13 to £14 in October.

James Cash reported a satisfactory financial position. As he will be away for most of April, branch Treasurers are being asked to send their returns to John Hendrie for the period to end of March. As the BBKA and BDI payments made at the end of April will only include payments listed on the returns from October to March we cannot wait until the Treasurer returns to England otherwise there would be delays in possible compensation payments made by members but not received by the County nor sent to BDI.

With regards to the subscription from October this is likely to be £38 or £39 depending on the amount branches need. Representatives will be discussing this at their committee meetings and will make the decision at the June Council meeting. In either case the subscription will be less than the current £40.

David Wood advised that we still need a new Secretary for the Honey Show committee as Peter Baker is retiring. There are four meetings each year. *(volunteers please!)* Julian Audsley said the Education Committee will be putting an education page on the kbka website amongst other things this will advertise courses. Margaret Thomas will be the speaker at the lecture day on Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> November.

Further information about the move to Weybridge, Surrey for the National Honey Show was given, we hope it will be well supported by Kent beekeepers as access is easy. Two very successful workshops demonstrating the use of organic acids as treatment methods for varroa were reported. There had been 80 participants at Wye.

### **National Honey Show has New Venue**

The National Honey Show is moving from Hendon to St. Georges College at Weybridge, Surrey. The Hendon venue appeared to be unpopular with many beekeepers and this new venue hopes to solve some of the problems. There is good access by Road, one mile from junction 11 of the M25, and a short walk from Addlestone railway station. #### **Wax Moth Treatment**

We are often asked about treatment for Wax Moth and the following note from the BBKA about using Certan<sup>TM</sup> may be of interest.

It has been known for some time that the bacterium *Bacillus thuringiensis* is a specific pathogen of the larval form of moths and butterflies. (Lepidoptera). It kills the caterpillars once they are infected. "Certan<sup>TM</sup>" is the proprietary brand name of a live culture of the bacterium. The culture is appropriately diluted with water and sprayed onto combs. Control is effective and self-perpetuating while there are larvae hatching and available to be infected. Winter kills off the wax moth larvae and also the bacterium. This treatment has an appeal as a biological control; however, it should not take the place of hygienic management. Clean hives and clean equipment together with regularly changed combs should not make wax moth a problem. Varroa floors under a bee-proof mesh have proved to be rich breeding grounds for Wax Moth. This clearly demonstrates the control exerted by bees themselves. Floors sprayed with Certan<sup>TM</sup> about monthly during the active season have shown no sign of wax moth.
