"Beekeepers @ KSRC" will be running courses again in 2015. The new venue is about a mile from Sittingbourne station in the Swale Skills Centre. This building is used primarily for engineering training but the adjacent building will be re-fitted with labs and the KSRC equipment reinstated there by September 2015. In the meantime, there are classroom facilities in the existing building and I have the kit to be able to provide a pop-up microscopy lab if required. Initially at least, this facility will only be available Monday to Friday.

Julie, Adrian and I will be pulling together a programme of courses which, as in previous years, will be aimed either at Improvers or at providing courses on beekeeping-related interests (e.g. skep making) where individual clubs might struggle to fill places. I would be delighted to hear from you if you have either **suggestions for courses** we should run or you would like to become **part of the tutor team** at KSRC? We will aim to have a schedule ready in the next few weeks.

Courses in preparation for the BBKA exams and assessments are always popular and I fully expect that KSRC will be offering those, both to beekeepers from Kent and indeed the whole of the South East. In reciprocal arrangement therefore I'm happy to advise you that there is to be a General Husbandry Assessment training day in Surrey in January, led by Master Beekeeper Alastair Welch. This may be a useful start to the year for any students you are preparing for this assessment – see below.

I am pleased to let you know that the BBKA system 'ARK' is now live and available for use by BBKA members.

As you may recall from earlier announcements, ARK is derived from the checklists of competencies produced for the Course in a Case (CiC) material, one for each CiC. It allows beekeepers to see the fundamental skills they will need and to monitor their own progress towards them. There is an initial set of resources available through links for each skill (or element) and we expect to add more resources in due course. They include documents, videos and guidance notes from the BBKA and selected external agencies such as the NBU. In addition, when a new training course is listed ARK has the ability to send out notification emails to each user with matching preferences set in their profile. If your association is offering training please make sure that your courses are listed. I am especially keen to see courses for Improvers added to the list. Historically it has proved difficult to make beekeepers aware of the opportunities in adjoining associations let alone nationally. This need no longer be the case and Improver courses can attract wider interest. To add a course use the 'Submit a course or event' button at the bottom of the ARK homepage and complete the form. It is not necessary to login to do so.

On first visit please use the 'Signin' button at the top left. You will need your BBKA website Members Area login and password and you will need to have a valid email address in your BBKA Members profile. You will be asked to create your own password for ARK. On subsequent visits you can log directly in to ARK using 'Login' at the top right of the screen using this password.

Why not take a moment to set up your profile in ARK so you can receive the most relevant information, then explore the checklist elements that match your level of experience.

Please feel free to cascade this information to others in your local association as required.

ARK has been created to support a range of devices including laptops, smart phones and tablets using standard browsers such as Google Chrome. The 'Help' buttons on each page will lead you through the features available.

Most beekeepers accumulate beeswax, either from cappings or melted combs, which could be sold or exchanged for foundation, but many only have a small amount, so they just store it in the shed and don't know what to do with it.

There are a number of products that can be simply made with quite small quantities of beeswax. These can be used by you and your family or can make useful and unusual presents. The good thing is you know what the ingredients are.

The demonstrator will be Jim Ryan who we are bringing over from Thurles, Co Tipperary. Jim is a very good demonstrator of making beeswax products. His methods are simple and he has a very good way of showing you how easy these items are to make, using minimal equipment.

The content of each day may be different, but Jim will begin all by cleaning wax, then making such things as furniture polish, furniture cream, lip balm, skin cream, moisture bars, soap, etc.



He will also look at using honey in recipes – honey lip balm, honey soap, etc. There may also be some alternative recipes that do not contain nut oils.

We are expecting this to be popular and as places are limited you will need to book early. If you are available on Monday we would prefer you took that option, to make more spaces for those who work and may only be available on Sunday. This is a rare opportunity to see a top demonstrator.
