Council Meeting 13th March 2010

Fourteen representatives from ten Branches together with the four officers attended the Council meeting in March.

KCAS are reapplying for planning permission for the work on the show ground and hence we will have use of the Margaret Calder Pavilion for the foreseeable future.

Some branches said there was a long delay in members receiving their BBKA Welcome packs. The Education Committee is to investigate whether a Kent Welcome pack was a viable option.

BBKA have confirmed that check-mite can be used to control varroa. Because check-mite contains coumaphos which is an organo-phosphorus pesticide it was agreed we should not recommend its use to KBKA members.

Clive Watson had attended and reported it was a long day, the meeting finishing at 6:30 pm. The following were elected. President. Martin Smith from Lancashire. Executive Committee. David Bancalari, Dawn Girling, Julian Routh & Brian Ripley. KBKA is no longer the only limited company after Lancaster BKA were elected as a new member. Also elected Rutland BKA. and Bees for Development as a Specialist member. A full report is contained in the April BBKA News.

James Cash reported a satisfactory financial position and there was no need to raise subscriptions for the next year. The recommendation for branches to consider prior to the decision being taken in June is to keep subscriptions at their current level. There are some minor changes for the dates Branches make their returns to County to fit in better with BBKA, BDI and Gift Aid. If Branches would like electronic payment of subscriptions they can have the details put on the subscription form, this is in preparation for the banks plan to phase out cheques. Card payments will not be accepted because of the charges applied. Honoraria were raised to cover increased work loads with rising membership.

It was suggested that Branches could order BeeCraft direct rather than it being done centrally. Each organisation is only permitted one update each month by BeeCraft Ltd and branches will be able to react more rapidly than going through the County Membership Secretary in these days of rapidly increasing membership. Reps to take the paper back to their branches and then come to the June meeting with a view as to whether KBKA should make this change. BeeCraft are now offering a digital version of the magazine as an alternative to the printed copy. The cost will be £16 for digital and for KBKA £18 for printed copy (after discount). It was suggested there may only be limited demand for the digital copy because it was not possible to download or print it on computer. Again reps to ask their branches whether KBKA should include the digital copy as a subscription option.

Election of Officers and Committees.

Chairman – Clive Watson having served four years was not eligible for re-election. David Wood was elected.

Vice-Chairman – Clive Watson was elected.

General Secretary - John Hendrie, County Treasurer - James Cash and Membership Secretary - John Hendrie were re-elected unopposed.

Examinations Secretary – vacant but John Hendrie will undertake the duties for the next year.

Executive Committee: Peter Hutton, Mike Wall, William Mundy and a vacancy.

Show Committee: Dr. J. Cowan, B. Farrow, Ronnie Eagle, Lesley Fancote, Margaret May, W. Mundy, B. Smith, W. Thomas, M. Wall, B. Wood.

Education Committee: Terry Hardy, K. Erhardt, Lesley Fancote and J. Audsley.

John Hendrie said this was the last time he would stand as General Secretary.

David Wood is involved with a Field Trial with Waverlux, based in Tunbridge Wells. This is a project to feed a pollen substitute as a spring stimulant.
