BBKA ADM 2010

The 50th Annual Delegate Meeting of BBKA was held on Saturday 16th January There were 59 voting delegates, only a few Associations were not represented, and in total over a hundred people attending, including the BBKA executive and visitors. Clive Watson represented us this year as Brian Palmer was unable to attend.

A number of announcements were made, of new initiatives and involvements by BBKA, including a three-year funding of £12,000 per year for the work on hygienic bees being done at Sussex University, and the fact that Saga is about to launch and fund an Adopt-a-Hive scheme and B&Q are to stock the Beehaus!

New Executive members elected are David Bancalari, Dawn Girling, Brian Ripley and Julian Routh. For the Examinations Board David Aston, Ken Basterfield and Pam Gregory will serve three years, with Tom Canning and Pete Sutcliffe elected for one year.

On the resolution that BBKA should cease to endorse pesticides as soon as contractually possible, the argument divided broadly between those in favour, claiming it was a matter of credibility for BBKA and the public perception, and the contrary view that it was better to guide farmers to using more 'bee-friendly' pesticides when there was a choice The vote was 25 for the motion, 30 against, 3 abstentions. The proposers then called for a membership vote, where the number of paid-up members in each Association is counted (rather than just one vote per Association) and the result, while still a defeat for the Proposition, was a lot clearer, with 4,588 for, 9,829 against and 1,025 abstentions. The resolution instructing the Executive to re-join the Healthy Bees Project Board was proposed by Dorset BKA. Tim Lovett vacated the chair to argue passionately against this, while others felt that BBKA must be involved. There were questions of credibility if the Executive was 'ordered' back in, and how the situation might change if there is a change of government in a few months. The proposition was defeated, 7 for, 39 against, 10 abstentions, so BBKA remains outside the Board. Lancaster BKA, Rutland BKA and Bees for Development were all elected as members of BBKA.

Council Meeting 12th December 2009

Fifteen representatives from ten Branches together with three officers attended the Council meeting in December.

Letter from Abby Brindley, event manager, mds shows, about an event at the hop farm on the first May bank holiday in 2010. They will defray some costs but clashes with our events.

FERA about an invitation from the Healthy Bees Project Management Board's Chair offering City and Guilds train the trainer courses similar to what the Education Committee is proposing but we need to respond to FERA by 7th January. Education committee will consider training at its next meeting. There is now enough money from Branch returns to cover the cost of BeeCraft for 2010. Electronic payment of subscriptions to be considered as banks plan to phase out cheques.

It looks as if we will have the Margaret Calder pavilion for a few more years because KCAS are reviewing their development plans.

The BBKA propositions (Listed in December BBKA News) were considered and our delegate given advice on how to vote. The important outcomes are given above.

Concern expressed by some about the BDI terms and conditions that reduce compensation if claims made in more than two consecutive years. Concern about bees being killed by poison, anyone dealing with bees killed by chemicals should take photographs and document all relevant facts.

National Honey Show in 2009 had considerably larger attendance than 2008. More space has been booked for 2010 and lectures will be held in a larger hall.

Concern was expressed about delays in arrival of BBKA welcome packs.

Money for Bee Research

As some of you know the BBKA has been building up a Research Fund for many years. Here is part of a press release issued on 14th January.

The British Beekeepers' Association, which represents more than 16,000 of the country's amateur beekeepers, will give a £36,000 grant to support the work of a post graduate student over the next three years, in the prestigious Laboratory of Apiculture and Social Insects (LASI) at Sussex University.

'Hygienic' bees are able to detect and remove diseased larvae from the colony, and so reduce the spread of disease within the hive. Increased understanding of this behaviour may provide opportunities to improve the resistance of honeybees to a number of the diseases which affect them.

The donation will be specifically used to support a PhD student, Gianluigi Bigio, working under Professor Ratnieks's supervision and with two of the department's researchers Norman Carreck and Dr Karin Alton on Project 1 of the Sussex Plan for Honey Bee Health and Well Being- 'Breeding disease -resistant 'hygienic' honey bees'. The work will start in March 2010.

South East Honey Survey 2009

The summary of Alan Byham's survey is given below:

These results are compiled from beekeepers owning between 1 and 39 colonies with total yields between 0lbs and 1852lbs. Interestingly the largest crop did not come from the beekeeper with the largest number of colonies. (1852lb from 20 cols – 92.6lb/col) The highest yield per colony (121.3lb) came from a beekeeper with 3 colonies, the total crop being 364lb. There is a wide variation in reported average honey yields – from 0 to 121.3 lbs per colony. The average yield, 35lb is a substantial decrease over the previous year's figure (45lb), which was mainly due to the poor weather in the summer and the short season, as mentioned above. However, this year average prices are higher than last almost breaking the \pounds 4.00 per lb. Again I received some surveys indicating that no honey had been collected (9 responses, 3 of which were 'new starters' this season).

Direct sale to customers is the commonest method of honey sales - 144 respondents provided a figure for this. As usual there is little agreement over price. The average price this year is the highest it has been at £3.96, which is a much better average, although I feel that £4.00/lb should be the minimum asking price, taking into account the cost and time involved in producing honey. Using figures from this survey, an average crop of honey per colony was worth £138.60 when sold direct at average price. (2008 = £160.65) 34 replies indicated selling honey wholesale to a retailer. At the average wholesale price, an average crop of honey per colony was worth £122.50. (2008 = £120.15).
