# **OXALIC ACID TREATMENT**

Are you planning an Oxalic Acid treatment of your colonies this winter? Should you be I have a very special offer which I hope will be of interest. By good fortune I have obtained a substantial number of veterinary automatic dosing guns which are new and in their original packaging. They are



adjustable in the one to ten ml range and are therefore ideal for accurate metering of dilute Oxalic Acid solution. One press of the trigger and the selected dose (probably five ml) issues from the nozzle, release the trigger and the gun is recharged. #### **Feeding Bees**

There is information being circulated indicating that some sugar beet may be treated with neonicitinides during production. This is probably another reason to consider using sugar sourced from sugar cane. Tate & Lyle and Fair-Trade sugar are normally produced from sugar cane, just check what is written on the packet. Feeding should be completed by mid October to ensure the syrup is capped in the cells to avoid possible fermentation. Bees have great difficulty in capping stores when the weather is cold. Some colonies are quite short of stores where they have been breeding rapidly in the warm last two weeks in September. Other colonies seem to have collected well from the ivy and balsam. You must check and feed appropriate quantities of sugar.
