Lifeline is a sell-out international musical coming to Off-Broadway for 5 weeks in August and September this year! We are currently seeking scientists and healthcare professionals to volunteer to join our healthcare chorus. The chorus will appear with a cast of professional West End and Broadway actors on stage for this unique production about Alexander Fleming's extraordinary discovery of penicillin and the threat of antimicrobial resistance, or AMR.

This is an auditioned role with the opportunity for you to perform **for one week** (see below for details) of the off-Broadway production in August/September 2024. About the musical

Lifeline is reaching the end of 6 years of development, having sold out previous runs at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe in 2018 and 2022, and a tour to Washington DC and Atlanta, performing to over 13,000 audience members. In 2023, it was showcased in Barbados for the Prime Minister Mia Mottley, as well as at the Houses of Parliament in London. 2024 is an exciting year for the show: we will release a concept album with Center Stage Records (formerly Broadway Records) in May and will run for 5 weeks in New York's premiere off-Broadway theatre, Signature Theatre, in the run up to the High Level meeting on AMR in the UN in September.

Lifeline tells the story of Scottish scientist Alexander Fleming's world-changing discovery of penicillin in 1928, charting the rise and fall of antibiotics. Fleming's story weaves with junior doctor Jess's, whose childhood sweetheart Aaron is recovering from cancer treatment today, almost 100 years after antibiotics were discovered. But just as he is desperate to resume normality and rekindle something between him and Jess, his life hangs in the balance, as he waits to see if this miracle cure still works well enough to save him.
