<p>Children need linguistic challenges that are a step above their own language. One way to get a step above is to use a working method called "scaffolding". The support can be to give the child self-confidence by; wait the child in, help keep the thread, reformulate and summarize, ask questions that make the child think further and praise and encourage.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Global sustainability goals </p>

<p>The children have shown great interest in nature and therefore we decided that our project area will be Nature. Objective: Understanding of connections in nature and nature's various lifecycles, knowledge of plants and animals as well as simple chemical processes. 🍀 We will discover and explore 🐾 nature & animals. The children observe nature and see how it changes, e.g. what happens now that it's autumn? 🍁🍂 We do activities in nature and adventures with the animals that exist. 🐾🐛🐛🐛🐛 We want to create imagination for couples so it should be encouraged in different activities that the children should have! 😊</p>	<p>We carry the children's interests in food and planets with us this month to explore further around them. We will also work with mathematics (counting, sorting, categorizing, being able to distinguish numbers, pairing, etc.). In addition, we will spend a lot of time playing outside in the yard/forest and enjoying the autumn weather, which will offer some wind, sun, rain and puddles. In connection with the game, we continue to practice respecting each other, sharing, being kind, waiting our turn and showing forgiveness. We also meet a mascot in the forest that we take with us to preschool! 😊</p>
<i>Ceti</i>	<i>Proxima</i>
<p>Our project has started and we will travel to all continents 🌍 We will learn about our countries and those of others. The goal of the project is for the children to get to know how other people in the world live, to build respect for other cultures, to emphasize diversity and to emphasize that we are all different but also the same and of equal value. We will start with activities related to culture and traditions food, dancing, etc.</p> <p>Every Thursday and Friday we will do activities related to the project. On Mondays and Wednesdays, we will do outdoor activities, e.g. forest visits. We will also visit a supermarket to show children how we shop for food, talk about the food you eat at home and about food from different cultures.</p>	<p>We at Proxima welcomed Levi and a new educator Jaya! This month we start on our project where we explore nature with our friend Trollet. The children love the troll and they have shown a great interest in animals and nature. The goal is for the children to have an adventure with the troll and discover and explore nature, animals and nature's cycles. In addition, we will construct with different materials, techniques and tools. The troll is a fellow researcher and will help us to have respect for each other, develop solidarity, responsibility and we should (prevent conflicts) through drama, pictures and fairy tales. Using our imagination together gives children the opportunity to be responsive and increase their empathy. We will also work with experiments, feelings and reading aloud where we learn new words and forms of expression.</p>

<p>We continue with our waterproject. The children have been offered to explore water in liquid and solid form. During the activities, we document what the children do, the children can also document themselves by taking pictures with the Ipad, we do this to try to get a glimpse of their interest. It is what leads us further in the project also into next month. In the project, we get the opportunity to work with the language when we talk about what the children are doing. We continue to read aloud every day and we see more and more how the children themselves pick out books and leaf through them. Feel free to let the children hear fairy tales at Polyglutt, where there are books in several languages. Every Thursday we have an excursion, we leave preschool at 9:10 to explore and play in our neighborhood.</p>
