LLANGRANOG TO NEW QUAY

Enjoy the wild beauty of the Ceredigion coastline in the company of porpoise, seals and dolphins as you walk to the picturesque town of New Quay, the inspiration for Dylan Thomas' play 'Under Milk Wood'. Lovely coastal views complement the walk.

THE DYLAN THOMAS NEW QUAY TRAIL

The trail takes us through narrow winding streets, past blue-plaqued houses and hostelries frequented by Dylan Thomas. We also enjoy leafy lanes, wooded coastal paths and beach - a landscape much loved by Dylan – with glorious views of Cardigan Bay, part of the Ceredigion Marine Heritage Coast and home of bottle nosed dolphins.

GNOLL PARK / PELENNY / PONTRHYDYFEN

From scenic Gnoll Country Park we climb onto the high ground near Castell-Fforch-Nant, with extensive views of the Vale of Neath and beyond, continuing on to Tonmawr, Pelena Mountain Centre, finally reaching Richard Burton's Pontrhydyfen and the Colliers tayern at Efailfach.

BRECON BEACONS TRAVERSE

This tough mountain crossing frames the Beacons' twin peaks on the skyline above the Neuadd reservoirs as we move along the Taf Fechan escarpment. An equally demanding descent follows with views over the glacial landscape of Cwm Llwch, Brecon and the whole of Mid Wales.

From the village of Myddfai, a place of great learning in the healing arts during the Middle Ages, we climb onto Myddfai Mountain for spectacular views of the Towy Valley and Carmarthen Fans before continuing to Usk Reservoir and Pont ar Wysg.

We visit Myddfai Community Centre, discovering local legends, and visit the church where the headstones of the last two physicians of Myddfai can be seen, before continuing through Llwynywormwood Estate (Prince Charles's retreat). We conclude with a pleasant rural walk into the ancient drovers town of Llandovery.

Laugharne Castle dominates the start of the walk which takes us along Railsgate Pill to Coygen Quarry. Returning to St.Mary's Church to view the grave of Dylan Thomas, we continue through woodland beside the Taf estuary to the famous Boat House.
