Of course, all of this is possible thanks to the support, hard work and fundraising initiatives shown by so many wonderful people.

DONATIONS ROUND 4

Our **fourth** round of donations were made in **November - December** 2017.





BEAUCROFT SCHOOL - £1.000

We were delighted to donate £1,000 to Beaucroft School's 16+ pupils' residential trip fund.

Our donation topped-up the funds to achieve the required £6,000. The pupils were planning a trip to Disneyland Paris to enjoy a wonderful holiday whilst gaining life-skills. Penny and Catherine were left in no doubt about the level of excitement as they presented the cheque — only 4 months to wait!

Following their trip in April 2018, we received this lovely Thank You card with a photo proving just how much the trip was enjoyed. Lovely to see those smiles!





SLEEPSAFE - £5,000

A repeat of our 2016 **donation of £5,000** to this amazing project — **Sleepsafe, part of Faithworks Wessex,** helping it to continue functioning through the winter months. Penny and Catherine visited with the cheque and learned more about the project. Our funding pays the cost of the night-time supervisor for a month. In Winter 2016/17, some 47 people were helped off the streets into accommodation and re-shaped lives. Louis's Foundation helped towards this.





LANGSIDE SCHOOL - £2.376

£2,376 was donated to **Langside School in Poole** in November 2017. Penny and Catherine visited this very special school where the 22 pupils face complex medical, physical and mental disabilities, but strive to learn and to respond. The visit touched our hearts and so, in addition to the £1,876 requested to equip a Musical Garden, we chose to donate an additional £500 to provide a treat for the children — all of whom certainly face difficulty in their lives.

Headteacher, Jon Seaward, chose ice-skating as the treat and we were really delighted to receive photos and positive feedback last month – leaving us in no doubt that it was £500 very well spent.



"Their enjoyment was apparent from their delighted expressions and happy vocalisations. Feeling the coldness, smell of the ice, swooshing of the skates and the feeling of whizzing around provided them with a lot of new and different sensory experiences. The responses of one or two children took us all by surprise, as usually they do not respond with much enthusiasm, leaving us feeling very emotional."

Wimborne Wagtails is a sociable swimming club for people of all ages with a physical or mental disability. The club meets at Wimborne's Q.E. Leisure Centre every Saturday morning. We were pleased to donate £1,325 to train young volunteer lifeguards.

THE BUS SHELTER DORSET - £2,000

On April 15th, we donated £2,000 to **The Bus Shelter Dorset**, a project based in Weymouth. Pictured with Penny is Rich Sawtell, whose innovative hard work saw the conversion of the bus into a 'home' for up to 17 people, and also volunteer Matt Chivers.

Our funding will pay for essential night-time staffing when the heavily-relied upon volunteer rota is struggling to cope. The project offers warmth, shelter, food and companionship to individuals who are homeless and wish for direction to help them improve their lives. They are referred to the project by Weymouth and Portland Borough Council, Julian House or the Lantern Trust.




EDWARD'S HORSERENITY SESSIONS - £2,000

We were delighted to make a very personal donation to **ten year old Edward** in order to fund a course of 20 sessions at Horserenity in Spetisbury, with teacher and therapist Sarah Vivian. Edward faces many difficulties including autism, Tourettes, ADHD and a processing disorder — all of which make his life tricky and preclude him from coping within mainstream, full-time school. He has been excluded from school and has missed 2 years of schooling.

His mum, Elaine, confirmed that it is only at Horserenity, where discrete education is delivered through animal therapy and outdoor pursuits, that Edward is happy, relaxed and learning. Currently, the family is pursuing a tribunal to gain a suitable place for Edward at a particular school where he will be understood and able to access the full-time education he deserves.


DOWNTON4FAMILY - £500

We donated £500 in April to Downton4Family which provides trained volunteers to support families who are facing challenging times. The service offers listening and encouragement to empower families to change their lives for the better.

Penny met with Helen Holgate, who founded the charity, and learned about the important role it plays in helping young people whose families are facing difficulties.

Our donation will help with training costs and administration, such as DBS checks.





ASHLEY'S BIRTHDAY BANK - £2,000

Our most recent donation, made in May 2018, was to **Ashley's Birthday Bank**. This incredible charity, run by three dedicated people – Anna, Danielle and Lynn – supports families and children at times of crisis. It serves Poole, Bournemouth and Christchurch and offes vital services to underprivileged or neglected youngsters and to families fleeing situations such as domestic violence or human trafficking. We donated £2,000 worth of Primark vouchers.

Anna Selby, pictured, thanked us by saying:

"Thank you so much again for the vouchers."

'They will make a huge difference to the families we support. It will enable us to provide for the older children at the domestic violence refuge, and also the human trafficking refuge, who very often have nothing. They will be able to go clothes' shopping with their Support Workers and choose their own clothes. They will also be given to the new mums who can buy some much needed clothing for themselves. We provide for the babies and children, but find it more difficult providing for the parents and older siblings.

They will also be used to purchase household items for children who go into care, who are in poverty, or who have been neglected and taken in by other family members. They will be able to purchase items to make their rooms homely and welcoming.

They will also be given to parents who can use them to purchase school shoes and uniform for their children.

The families we support are all in the Poole, Bournemouth & Christchurch areas. They are referred by Social Workers, Police Liaison Officers, Pastoral Care Workers, Refuge Workers, Health Visitors etc. Their situations vary from poverty, neglect and abuse to domestic violence and human trafficking. Three of us run the charity in our spare time, so every penny/item donated goes directly to the families in need.'


MARCH


