BUTTERFLY TUTORIAL



In a Magic Circle (MC) work: ch 6, 1 dtr, 2 tr, 1 dc, ch 3, 1sl st, ch 4, 1 tr, 1 dc, 1 tr, ch 4, 1 sl st, ch 4, 1 tr, 1 dc, 1 tr, ch 4, 1 sl st, ch 3, 1 dc, 2 tr, 1 dtr, ch 6, 1 sl st in yarn cirle. Don't cut the yarn.




Butterfly Body.
Ch 6. Start with a 10 in yarn tail. Place the chain row under the butterfly and up between the small wings forward to front. Insert hook from front side of butterfly, through space in the middle of the closed circle, and pull up the first ch on the ch row from back to front, and pull it through the last ch on the ch row.



Pull start-tail from MC and leave a small hole in the middle.

Go on with the yarn and work ch 7 for right antennae. Pull the tread tight for each ch.

Fasten off.






rochet Pattern for little and large

I have used cotton yarn and hook 3.0 mm. You can use any yarn or hook you wish depending on the size you like the butterfly to be.

GOOD LUCK AND ENJOY!



Ch 1, 1 sl st in yarn circle bet the large wings. From here you can go on working the the chain cord if you want to make two butterflies tog. Make one more butterfly and slip st them tog.

Ch 7 with the yarn tail from chain row for the left antennae.

Fasten off.

Pull the MC tight and weave in the end.
