The temple, with its serene beauty, provided an excellent setting for the children to delve into Buddhist practices.

Led by a monk, the children participated in a workshop that offered insights into the religion. The monk shared the story of the Buddha with us using pictures painted on the temple walls. Did you know it took four years and sixteen artists to complete these extraordinary paintings? In addition to this, the monk shared insights into the Buddhist principles, highlighting the significance of promoting positivity and compassion in our daily lives.


The children were ca<mark>ptivated thro</mark>ughout the trip, eagerly posing questions to the monk, for new knowledge and understanding.

In Science, Year 4 have thoroughly enjoyed their new topic 'Electricity'. After learning about how to keep safe when using electrical devices, the children have explored how to light bulbs by using batteries, and wires to create a complete electrical circuit. We have now moved onto incorporating switches and buzzers. This is in preparation to make our own working torches in D.T.



In Teaching of Reading, Year 4 are engrossed with the book 'The Wild Robot,' which is about a robot called Roz who discovers she is alone on a remote island. It is a lovely book which has captivated the children's empathy for Roz.

Community Police Visit

On the afternoon of Tuesday 16th April, our Year 6 pupils were visited by Police Officers from Croydon Police station.

As well as demonstrating some of their kit and showing pupils their patrol car, our visitors discussed a range of ways to keep safe when out and about, and highlighted the dangers of becoming involved in gang-related activity, particularly when transitioning to senior school. Children were reminded that one irresponsible incident at a young age could lead to the loss of career and travel opportunities for life. As well as answering many of the children's questions, the officers gave out advice on staying safe online and encouraged the children to keep studying hard.

Croydon Vision

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Changing how we SEE

A team of volunteers from the local charity, 'Croydon Vision' visited the school on Thursday 25th April to promote awareness of their services, which support Croydon's visually impaired population. Croydon Vision, which has its headquarters in Bedford Road, has now been providing support to people in local area for more than 100 years!

Our visitors explained about the many activities held at the centre, which include social events, computing lessons, art workshops, dance classes and cookery lessons, and encouraged people to visit and consider volunteering.

Equipment that is sometimes used by visually impaired people was demonstrated, including a hot-plate that talks when it is ready to use, a braille 'Rubik's cube' and digital pens which can read aloud any written words that are scanned.

We hope to take children who expressed an interest to visit the centre later in the year.

Children were able to use their World Book Day vouchers towards purchases and some had won vouchers for their book cover designs. Here are some photos from the fair!






Success in phonics - a shout out to the pupils who have completed the Read Write Inc. Phonics scheme!




